The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)

The **Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)** is a federally funded program that helps supplement the diets of low-income people, including seniors, families, single people and people who are homeless, by providing them with emergency food boxes and meals at no cost.



Get Emergency Food

You can get a **TEFAP (EFB)** box by visiting your local food pantry during normal distribution hours. To qualify for an EFT, you must self-declare that your income is below **185%** of the current Federal Poverty Level and bring identification and proof that you live in the pantry's service delivery area. A full list of eligibility factors is also posted in every food distribution site.

How to Receive TEFAP Food Boxes:

If you are already receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP or Food Stamps) benefits, you automatically qualify for **TEFAP**. 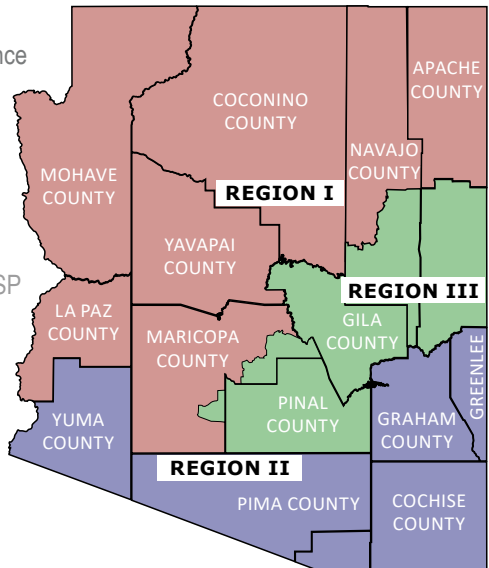
