

## Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP)

The Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP, pronounced Ay-zip), helps families of children with disabilities or developmental delays age birth to three years old. The program provides support and can work with children's natural ability to learn.

#### **Arizona Head Start and Early Head Start**

Head Start programs promote the school readiness of infants, toddlers, and preschoolaged children from at-risk families. Services are provided in a variety of settings including centers, family childcare, and children's own home.

Head Start programs also engage parents or other key family members in positive relationships, with a focus on family well-being.


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

Count the Kicks is an evidence-based program that teaches expectant parents about the importance of tracking fetal movements.


## **Division of Developmental Disabilities CARES Administration Office of** Individual and Family Affairs
