What is SNAP?

The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), formerly and commonly known as the Food Stamp Program, provides food-purchasing assistance for low and no-income people living in the United States. SNAP-O stands for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program Outreach.

What is the SNAP-O Partnership?

A network of non-profit organizations working on SNAP outreach and/or application assistance and committed to using a holistic approach to address hunger.

Who can join the SNAP Partnership?

Non-profit organizations (faith-based, food banks, health centers, etc.) or government agencies working in the community on SNAP outreach and/or application assistance.

How is the partnership funded?

Partners receive reimbursement for 40% of expenses on allowable SNAP activities.

Some allowable activities include:

- SNAP eligibility pre-screening
- SNAP application assistance
- Outreach activities and eligibility information distribution for SNAP
- Developing printed materials to provide information to clients

Some allowable administrative costs include:

- · Salaries and benefits of personnel involved
- Office supplies, postage, and travel necessary to reach goals
- Space lease or rental costs
