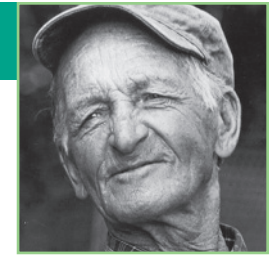
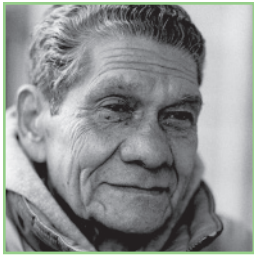

What Is the Family Caregiver Support Program?

This is a federal program enacted through the Older Americans Act Amendments of 2000 (updated in 2006), to provide supportive services to family caregivers.

What Services Are Offered?

There are five basic services:

1. Information about services in the community
2. Assistance in gaining access to supportive services
3. Reinforce the caregiver role through
 - Individual counseling
 - Organization of support groups
 - Caregiver training
4. Respite Care for temporary relief from caregiving responsibilities
5. Supplemental Services to complement the care provided by caregivers



Are there any eligibility criteria for services if I am a caregiver who is providing care to an older individual (60 years or older)?

Family caregivers of older individuals may access the five basic services.

However, for either respite care or supplemental services, the older individual must need assistance in performing two or more tasks listed below:

Toileting, bathing, dressing, grooming, eating, mobility or transferring;

OR

Laundry, shopping, housework, telephone, financial management, transportation and meal preparation.



Are there any eligibility criteria for services if I am family caregiver of a child under 19 years of age?

- Age 55 or older
- Live with the child
- Be the primary caretaker of the child

Are there any income limitations?

There are no exclusions based on income. However, volunteer contributions can be provided. A sliding fee schedule may be applied in some programs.



How do I apply for these services?

Services are provided by the local Area Agency on Aging. Refer to the back of the brochure for the Area Agency on Aging in your area and ask to speak with the Family Caregiver Support Program Coordinator.
