



Arizona's Legal Assistance Program offers information, advice, assistance, and advocacy to persons 60 years of age and older in civil matters to:

- Promote and preserve the autonomy, dignity, independence, and financial security of older adults
- Provide low-income older adults access to legal resources within the system of justice
- Advocate to preserve the rights, health, safety, and benefits of older adults

Civil issues may include, but are not limited to:

- Defense of guardianship
- Financial exploitation and consumer protection
- Long-term care options
- Adult protective services
- Income and Public entitlement benefits
- Financial and Health care directives
- Housing: home loss and eviction prevention
- Supportive decision-making
- Age discrimination



- Legal advice and assistance by an attorney (including, to the extent feasible, counseling or other appropriate assistance by a paralegal or law student under the supervision of an attorney)
- Counseling or representation by a non-lawyer, where permitted by law, under the supervision of an attorney (no criminal issues, traffic tickets, or civil lawsuits)

No-Fee Legal Assistance Services are available by:

- Phone
- In-person or virtual 1:1 meetings
- Home visits

The Division of Aging and Adult Services is committed to providing outreach and education on legal assistance to Arizona's most underserved communities, with particular focus on:

- Older adults with Limited English proficiency
- Older adults with disabilities
- Older adults living in rural areas
- Older adults living in congregate settings
- Older adults who are institutional placement, and
- Older adults with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders
