## Methodology

### Geography

This handbook provides various Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES) client and provider counts as well as census demographics summarized by Arizona counties.

### DES Client and Provider Information

Geographic Information Systems (GIS) software was used to determine the county for each client and provider using the client's residential address, the client's mailing address, or the provider's business address. The client and provider counts generally represent the total activity for state fiscal year 2020 (July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020) or, where appropriate, as a point-in-time count as of June 30, 2020. For more details about the client and provider datasets, refer to the *Data Sources and Descriptions: DES Client and Provider* section starting on page ii.

### Demographic Information

All demographic estimates were collected from the U.S. Census Bureau 2014 to 2018 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Product. The ACS product included estimates derived from surveys collected between January 1, 2014, and December 31, 2018. Since the estimates were based on a small sample size, the US Census published margins of errors to help identify the estimate's reliability. While this book does not provide the margins of error, they are available online through the US Census American FactFinder website (US Census Bureau, n.d.-b). For more details about the census demographic datasets, refer to the *Data Sources and Descriptions: Demographics Data* section starting on page v.

### Ranks and Percentages

The reports in Sections 1 through 3 include a county rank field and a percentage field. These values were included to help readers better understand the concentrations of the populations, clients, and providers within each county and compare those concentrations to other counties in the state.

The county rank field compares the census demographic estimates or DES client/provider counts to the other counties in the state. The field ranks each variable on a scale from 1 to 30, where 1 indicates the most populous. For example, of the 15 counties in Arizona, Apache County had the 11<sup>th</sup> highest population of residents age 85 and older.

The percentage field for census demographics identifies how much of the county's total population were represented by that demographic variable. The fields are labeled based on what base (e.g. population, households, families) the variable is being compared to. For example, in Apache County, 4.0 percent of the total population in the county was under the age of 3 and 17.7

per cent of the total families in the county were married with children living at home. In the case of the DES client and provider counts, the percentage field identifies the portion of the total statewide client/provider population that is located within each county.

- Adult Protective Services (APS) Reports Received
  - Reports of vulnerable adult mistreatment received by APS during state fiscal year 2020 (July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020).
  - To protect client confidentiality, counties with 75 or fewer APS clients were listed as having “1 to 75” clients.
  - Source: DES Division of Adult and Aging Services
  
- Arizona Early Intervention Program (AZEIP) Children
  - Children that had an active Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) with AZEIP on June 30, 2020.
  - To protect client confidentiality, counties with 11 or fewer AZEIP children were listed as having “1 to 11” children.
  - Source: DES Division of Developmental Disabilities, Arizona Early Intervention Program
  
- Childcare Authorized Children
  - Total children in families that had the authority to receive childcare services on June 30, 2020.
  - To protect client confidentiality, counties with 16 or fewer authorized children were listed as having “1 to 16” children.
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Child Care Administration
  
- Childcare Priority Wait List Children
  - Total children in families that were on the childcare subsidy priority wait list on June 30, 2020.
  - *Note: On June 30, 2020, there were no children on the wait list.*
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Child Care Administration

- DES Contracted Child Care Providers
  - Childcare group homes and centers that had an active contract with DES on June 30, 2020.
  - Additional maps were included to show the distribution of providers awarded a 4- or 5-star rating from the First Things First Quality First Program as well as providers with accreditation from one of the following national agencies: National Accreditation Commission, National Association for Family Child Care, National Early Childhood Program, National School Age Care Association, or the National Association for Education of Young Children.
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Child Care Administration
  
- Open Title IV-D Child Support Cases
  - Title IV-D child support cases that were open on June 30, 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Child Support Services
  
- Cash Assistance Families
  - Families that received cash assistance from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program in June 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility, Family Assistance Administration
  
- Cash Assistance Children
  - Total number of children that received cash assistance from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program in June 2020. Counts include individual children from families enrolled in the program as well as TANF child-only cases.
  - Source: DES Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility, Family Assistance Administration
  
- Medical Assistance Individuals
  - Individuals who were actively enrolled in the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) on June 30, 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility, Family Assistance Administration
  
- Nutrition Assistance Households
  - Households that had at least one person who received assistance from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) in June 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility, Family Assistance Administration

- Nutrition Assistance Families with Children
  - Families that received assistance from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) in June 2020, and had one or more children.
  - Source: DES Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility, Family Assistance Administration
- Nutrition Assistance Children
  - Total children from families that received assistance from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) in June 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Benefits and Medical Eligibility, Family Assistance Administration
- Developmental Disabilities Long Term Care Members
  - Individuals with developmental disabilities who were active in the Arizona Long Term Care System (ALTCS) on June 30, 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Developmental Disabilities
- Developmental Disabilities State Only Members
  - Individuals with developmental disabilities who were active in the Division of Developmental Disabilities state funded service on June 30, 2020.
  - To protect client confidentiality, counties with 12 or fewer DDD state-only members were listed as having “1 to 12” members.
  - Source: DES Division of Developmental Disabilities
- Developmental Disabilities Providers
  - Agencies with a qualified vendor agreement or special contract to provide services to individuals with developmental disabilities and were active within the DES Division of Developmental Disabilities provider network on June 30, 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Developmental Disabilities
- Unemployment Insurance Claimants
  - Individuals who filed an initial claim for unemployment insurance benefits between March 15, 2020 and July 15, 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Reemployment Assistance Administration



- Unemployment Insurance Employers
  - Employers that had an active account with the Unemployment Insurance Tax Program during the month of June 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Employer Engagement Administration
- Pandemic Unemployment Assistance
  - Individuals who filed an initial claim with the COVID-19 Pandemic Unemployment Assistance program between March 15, 2020 and July 15, 2020.
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Reemployment Assistance Administration
- Vocational Rehabilitation Clients
  - Individuals who were active in the Vocational Rehabilitation program on June 30, 2020.
  - To protect client confidentiality, counties with 12 or fewer vocational rehabilitation clients were listed as having “1 to 12” clients.
  - Source: DES Division of Employment and Rehabilitation Services, Rehabilitation Services Administration

#### Demographics Data

All demographic estimates were collected from the U.S. Census Bureau’s 2014 to 2018 American Community Survey (ACS) 5-Year Product.

- Population
  - All people, male and female, child and adult, living in a given geographic area (U.S. Census Bureau, n.d.-a).
  - Collected from ACS table B03002
- Household
  - All people occupying a housing unit (e.g. house, apartment, mobile home). Occupants may be a single householder, one or more related individuals (i.e. families), one or more un-related individuals, or a mix (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 76).
  - Collected from ACS table B19001

- Family
  - A householder and one or more other people living in the same household who are related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 79).
  - Collected from ACS table B11003
  
- Household English Proficiency
  - Households that had at least one person age five years or older who spoke only English or could speak English well compared to households where all members spoke English less than well or not at all (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 97).
    - Note: Survey respondents self-identified how well they spoke English.
  - Collected from ACS table C16002
  
- Age Group (Ages 0 to 17)
  - Age classification was based on the age of the person at the time the survey was completed. Survey respondents were asked to round their age down, regardless of how close their next birthday was (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 49).
  - Estimates did not include children living in group quarters, such as college dormitories, residential treatment centers, and correctional facilities.
    - This affected 2,975, or less than 1%, of the total children living in Arizona.
  - Collected from ACS table B09001
  
- Age Group (Ages 18 and older)
  - Age classification was based on the age of the person at the time the survey was completed. Survey respondents were asked to round their age down, regardless of how close their next birthday was (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 49).
  - Collected from ACS table B01001
  
- Ethnicity
  - Persons who were Hispanic or Latino compared to persons who were not Hispanic or Latino.
    - A person was considered Hispanic or Latino if they identified themselves as being of Hispanic, Latino, or Spanish origin. Note, ethnicity refers to the person's nationality group, heritage, lineage, or country of birth but not their race. People who identified as being Hispanic or Latino may be of any race (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 74).
  - Collected from ACS table B03002

- Race
  - Persons who identified themselves as belonging to a racial category (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, pp. 110-115).
    - Those who identified as being of two or more races or identified as belonging to some other race that was not an available category in the survey were classified in the “Other or Multiple Races” group in this handbook.
  - Collected from ACS table B02001
  
- Poverty Status
  - Poverty status was determined by comparing a family’s total income (i.e. income received by all related persons in the household) in the last 12 months to the 2018 poverty threshold appropriate for that person’s family size. If two or more families were living in the same housing unit, the poverty status was calculated separately for each family. If the family’s income was less than the poverty threshold, than each person in the family was considered to be living in poverty (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 107).
  - Collected from ACS table B17001
  
- Disability Characteristics of Non-Institutionalized Population
  - Estimates include civilian, non-institutionalized individuals who identified themselves as having one or more of the following conditions:
    - Vision: Person was blind or had serious difficulty seeing even while wearing glasses.
    - Hearing: Person was deaf or had serious difficulty hearing.
    - Cognitive: Due to a physical, mental, or emotional condition, the person had serious difficulty concentrating, remembering, or making decisions.
    - Ambulatory: Person had serious difficulty walking or climbing stairs (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, pp. 59-61).
  - The civilian, noninstitutionalized population included persons who were living in households or civilian non-institutional group quarters, which included group homes for the developmentally disabled, homeless shelters, and college dormitories.
    - The estimates did not include military personnel or persons living in institutional group quarters, such as correctional facilities, nursing homes, or hospitals (Brault, 2008, p. 1).
  - Collected from ACS table S1810

- Income Level by Household
  - Estimate includes the average income collected during the 12 months prior to the survey by the householder and all other individuals age 15 years or older living in the household, whether they were related to the householder or not. Income was adjusted for inflation to 2018 dollars before the estimate was calculated (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, pp. 84-87).
  - Collected from ACS table B19001
  
- Median Income
  - The middle-income value where half of the households in the area make more than the value and half make less. Income was adjusted for inflation to 2018 dollars (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, pp. 85-87).
  - Collected from ACS table B19013
  
- Population in Civilian Labor Force
  - Persons age 16 and older who were a part of the civilian labor force, whether employed or unemployed but had actively looked for work during the 4 weeks prior to completing the survey.
    - The estimates did not include people in the U.S. Armed Forces, those employed in unpaid positions (e.g. volunteers), or those who were not participating in the labor force (e.g. students, homemakers, or retirees) (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, pp. 64-66).
  - Collected from ACS table B23025
  
- Families with Own Children Under Age 18
  - A married or single householder who had at least one child under the age of 18 still living at home. Children were related to the householder either by birth, marriage, or adoption (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, pp. 78-79).
  - Collected from ACS table B11003
  
- Educational Attainment
  - The highest degree or highest level of school completed by individuals age 25 or older (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018, p. 62).
  - Collected from ACS table B15002

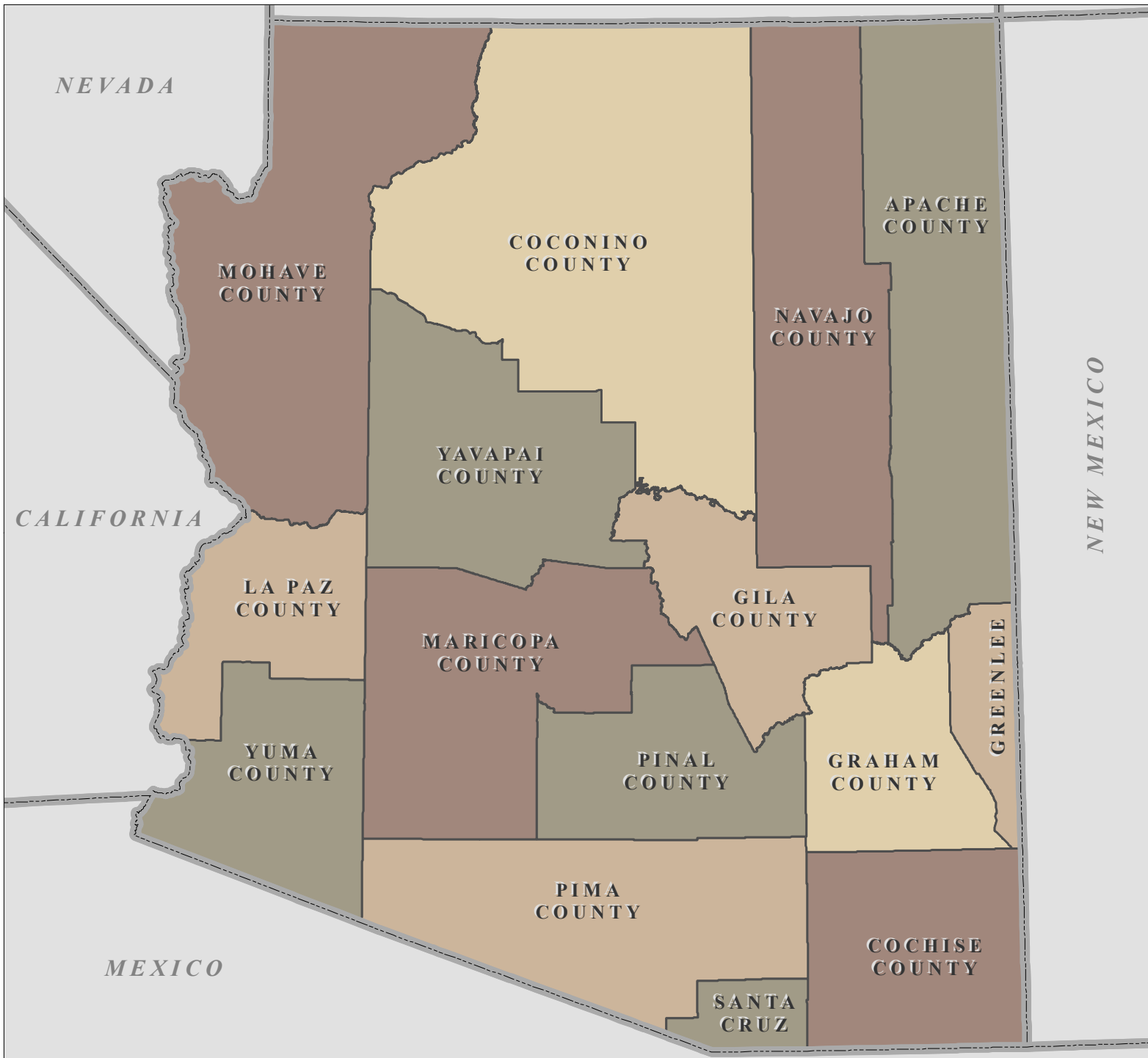

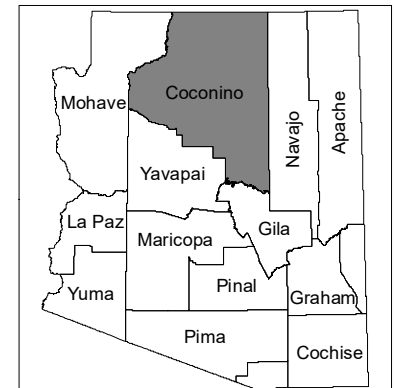


### Population per Square Mile

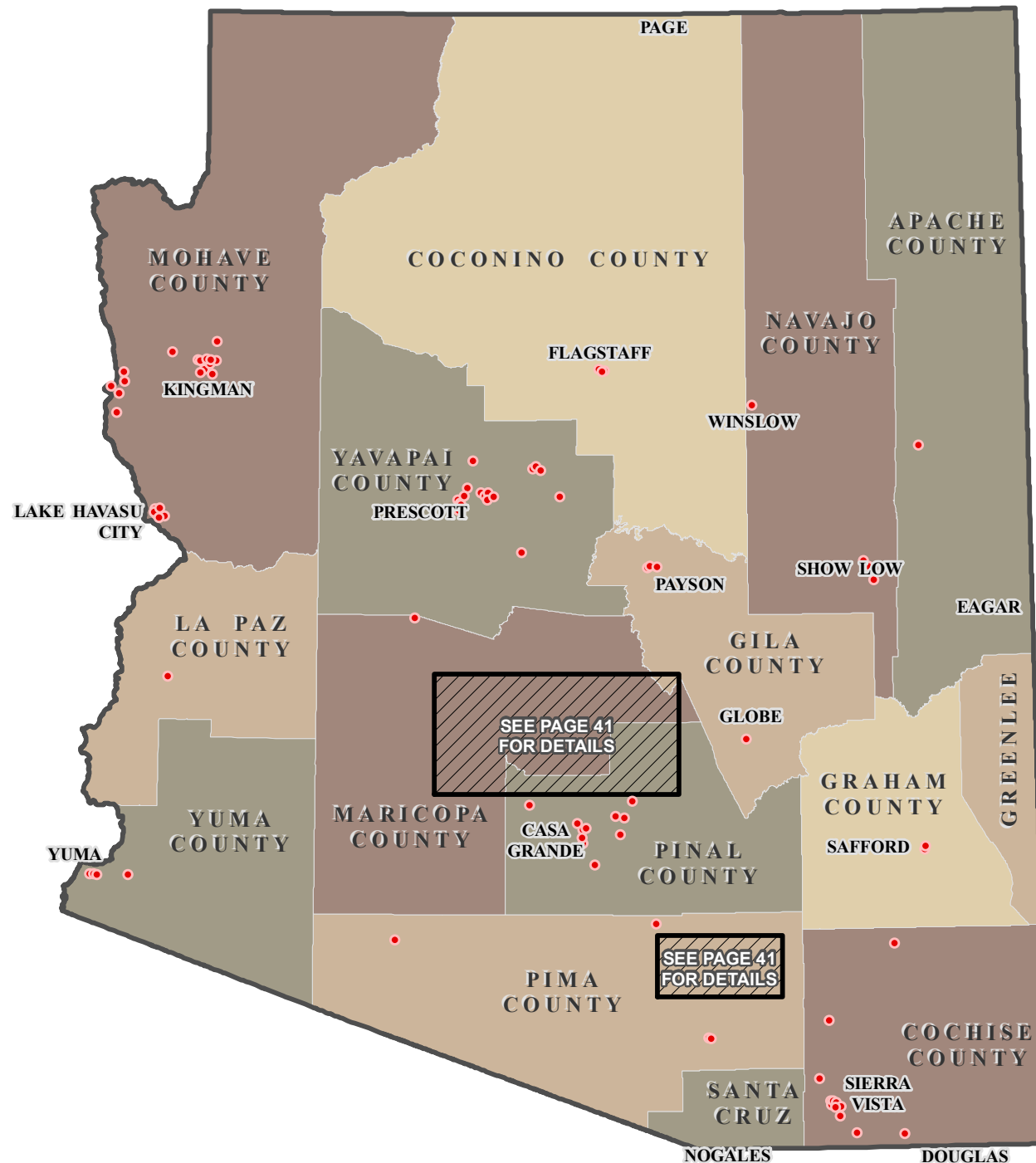

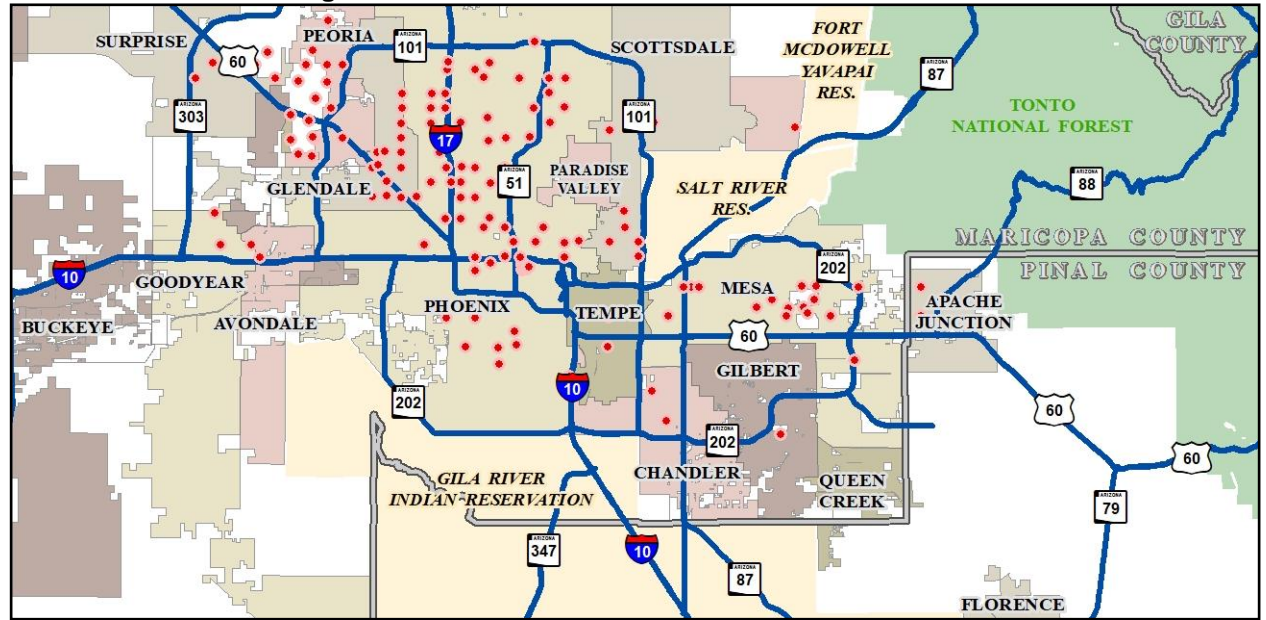

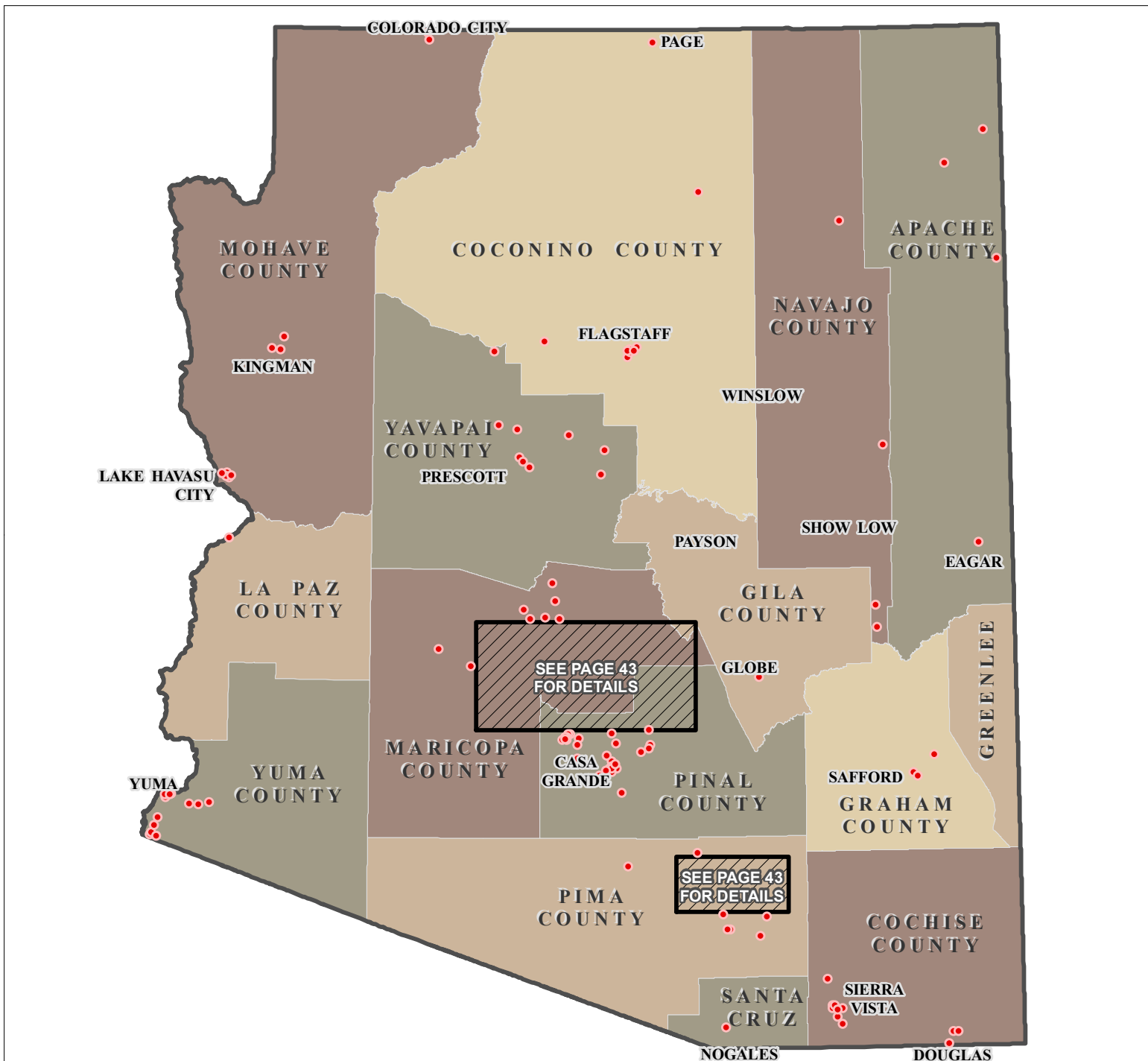

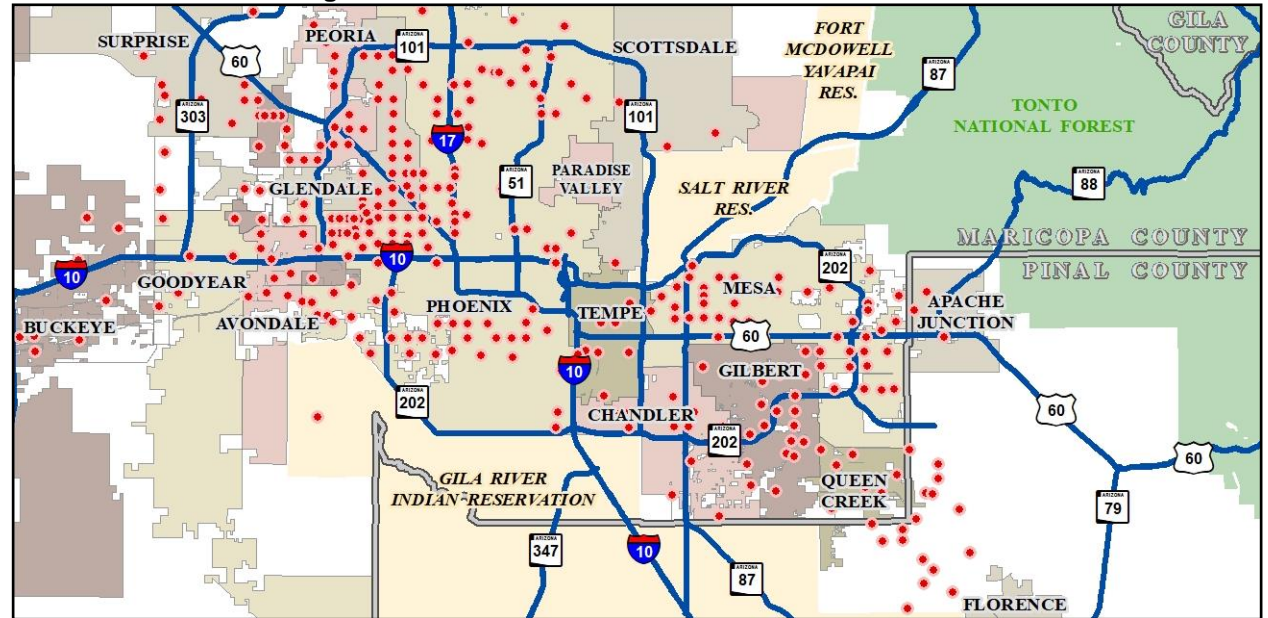

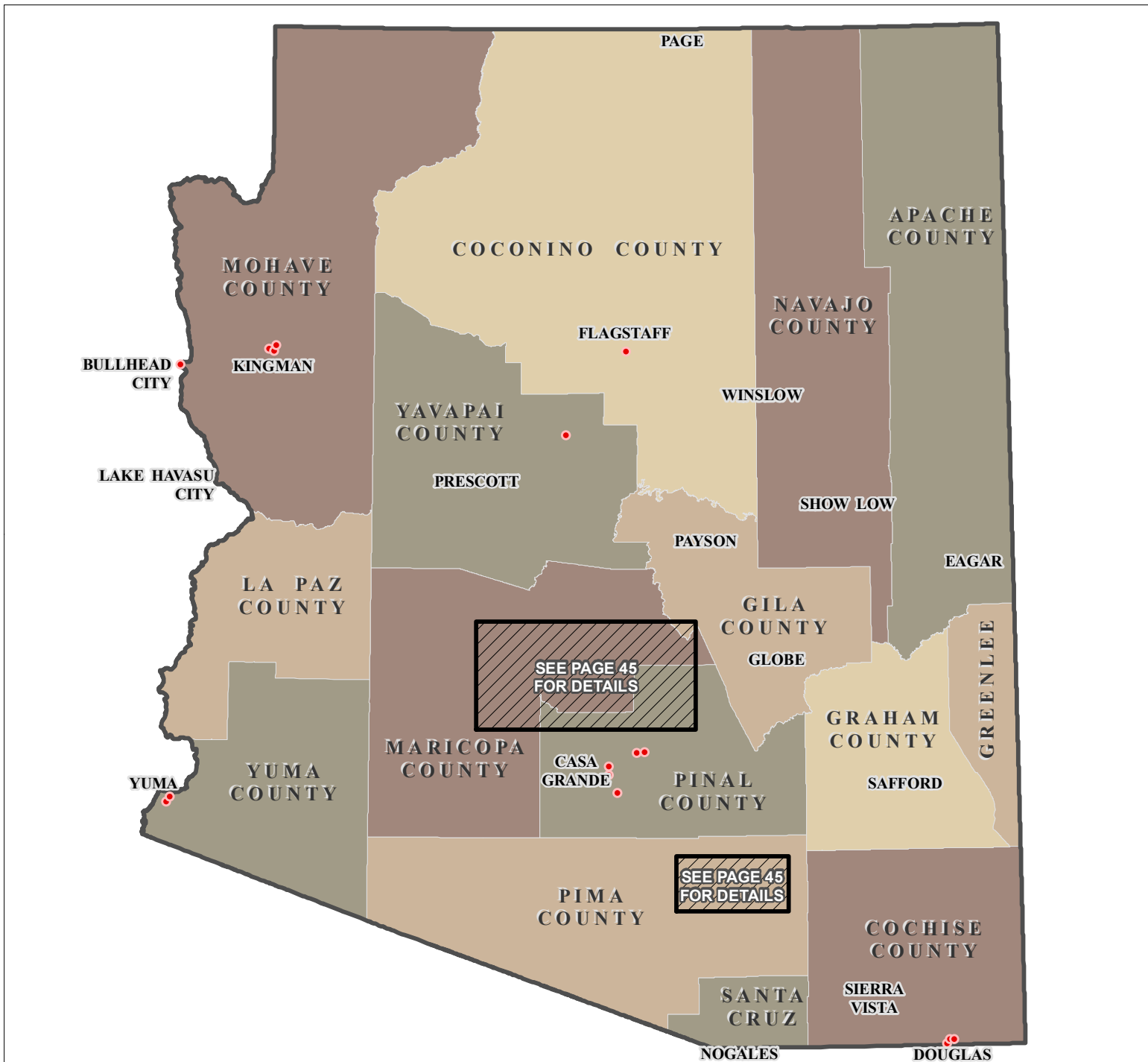

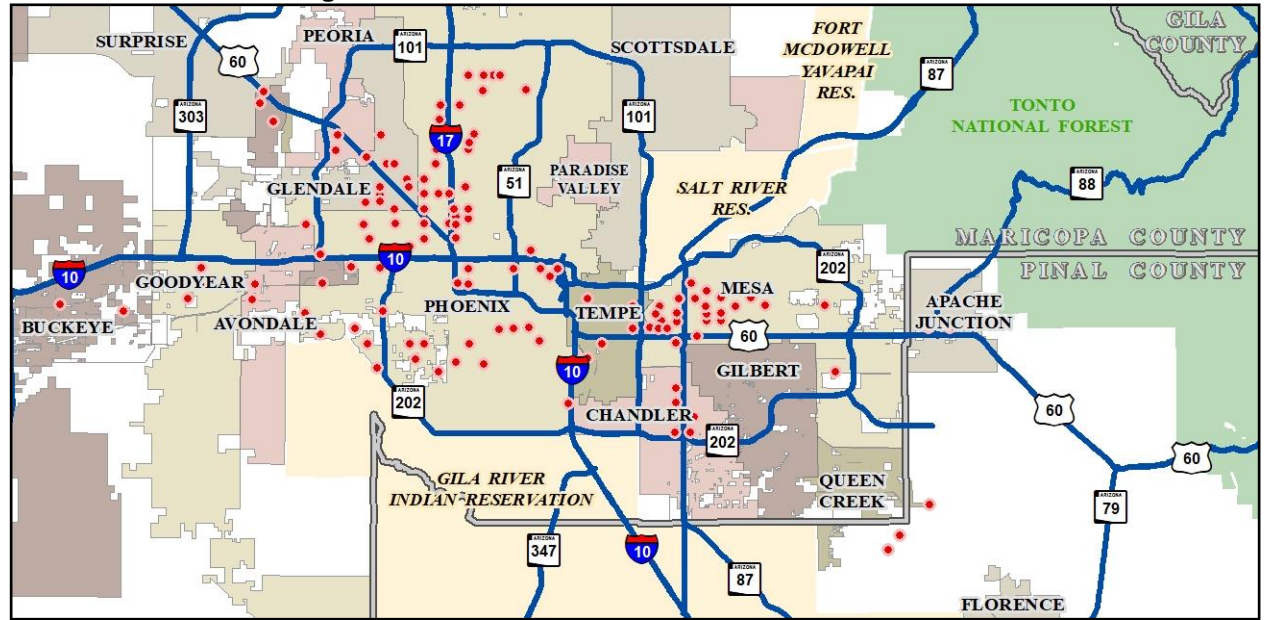
Map is showing the distribution of children from families that were authorized to receive child care services on June 30, 2020.



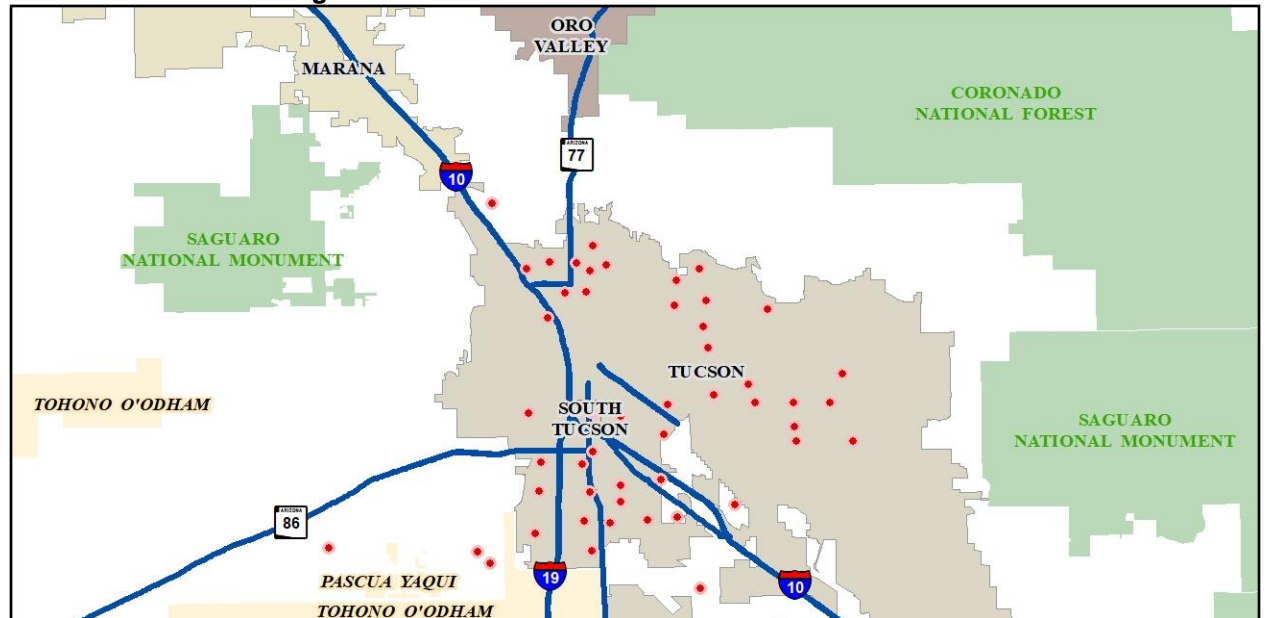

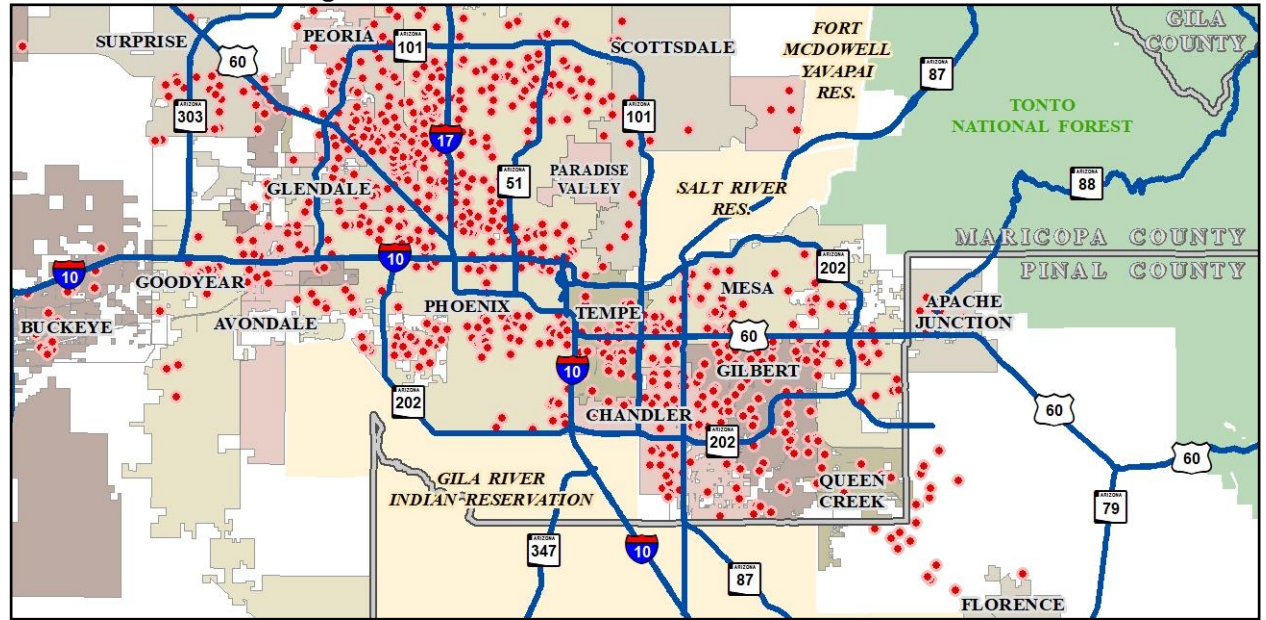

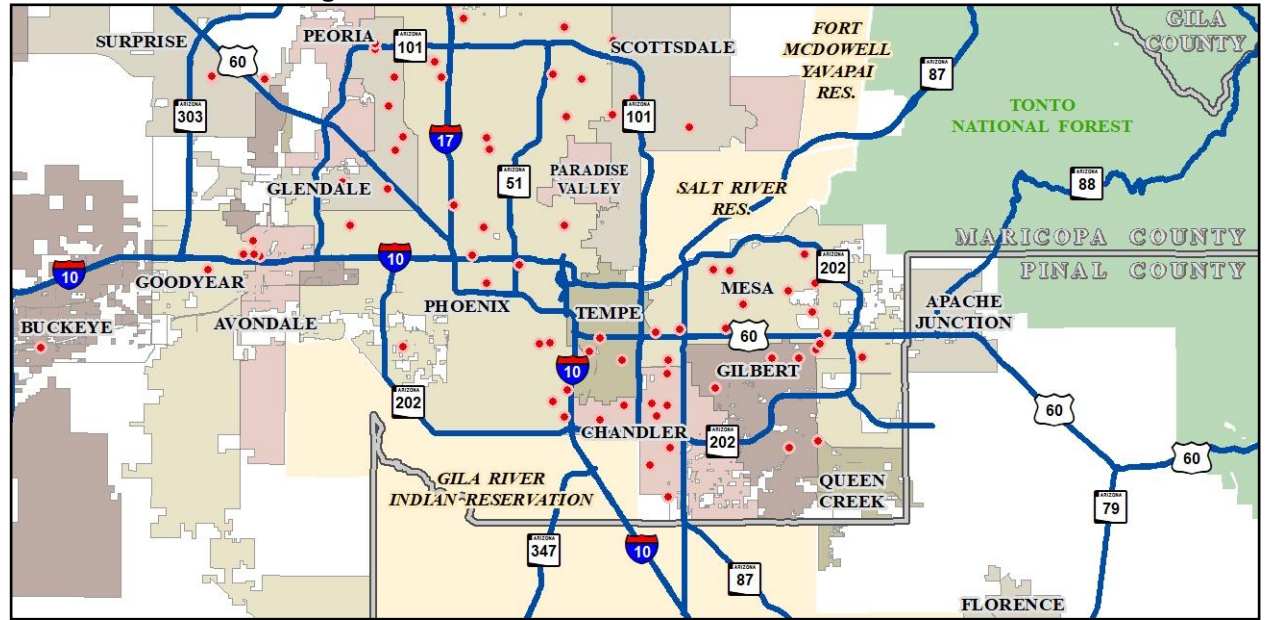

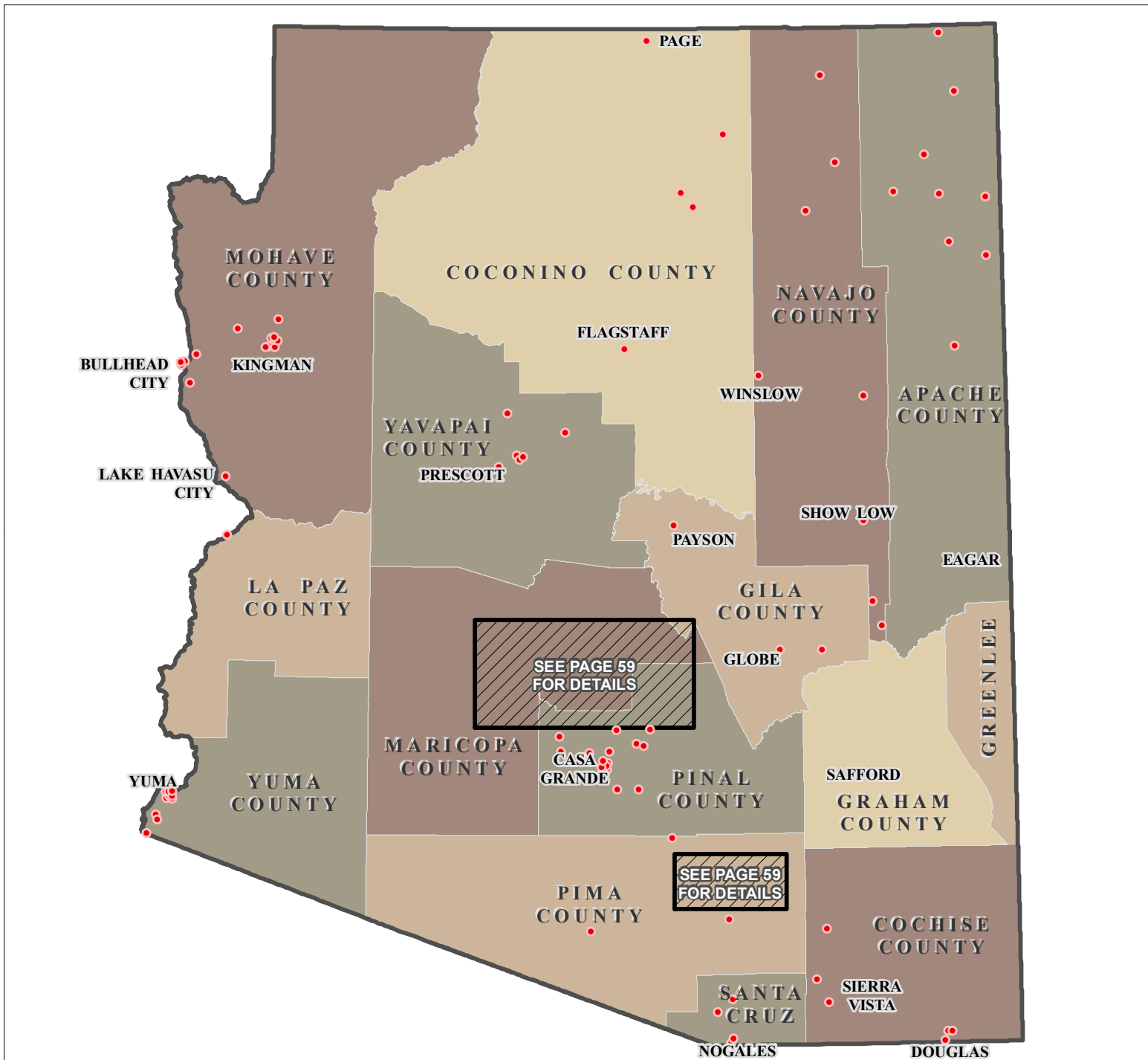

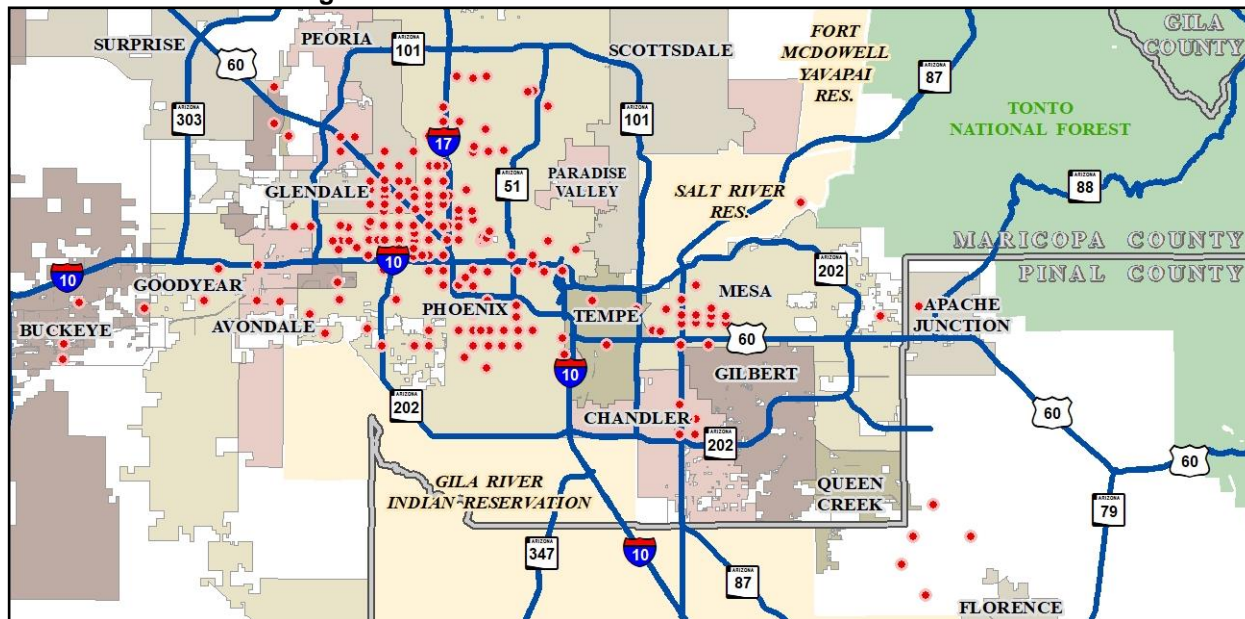

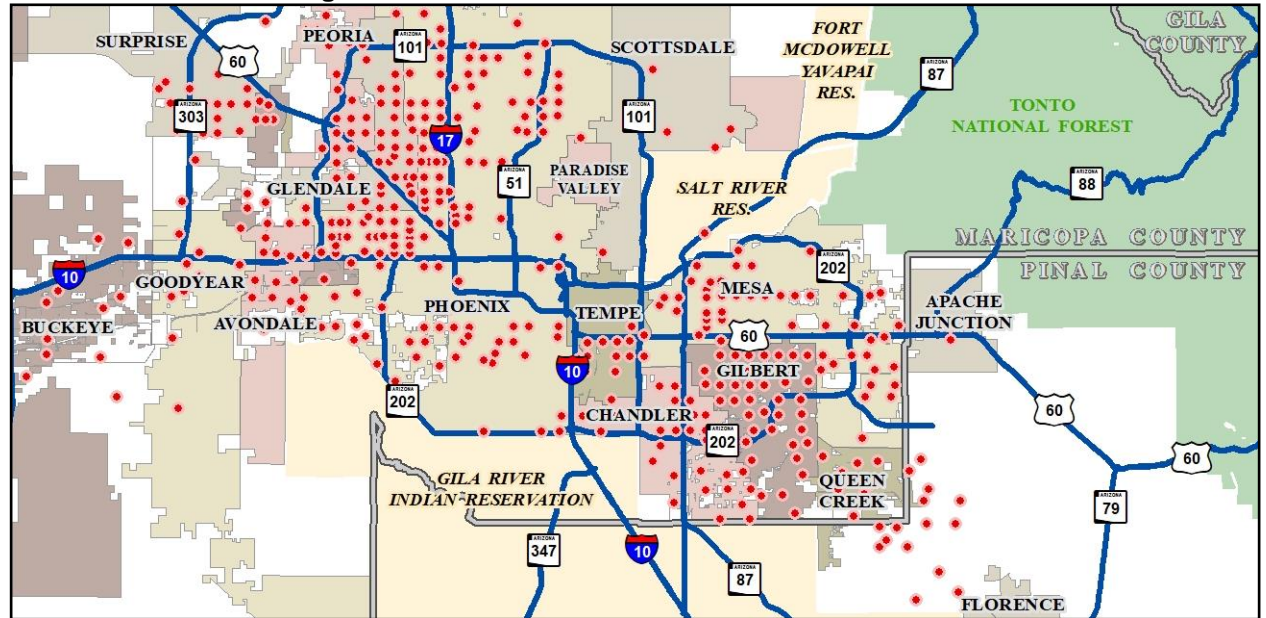

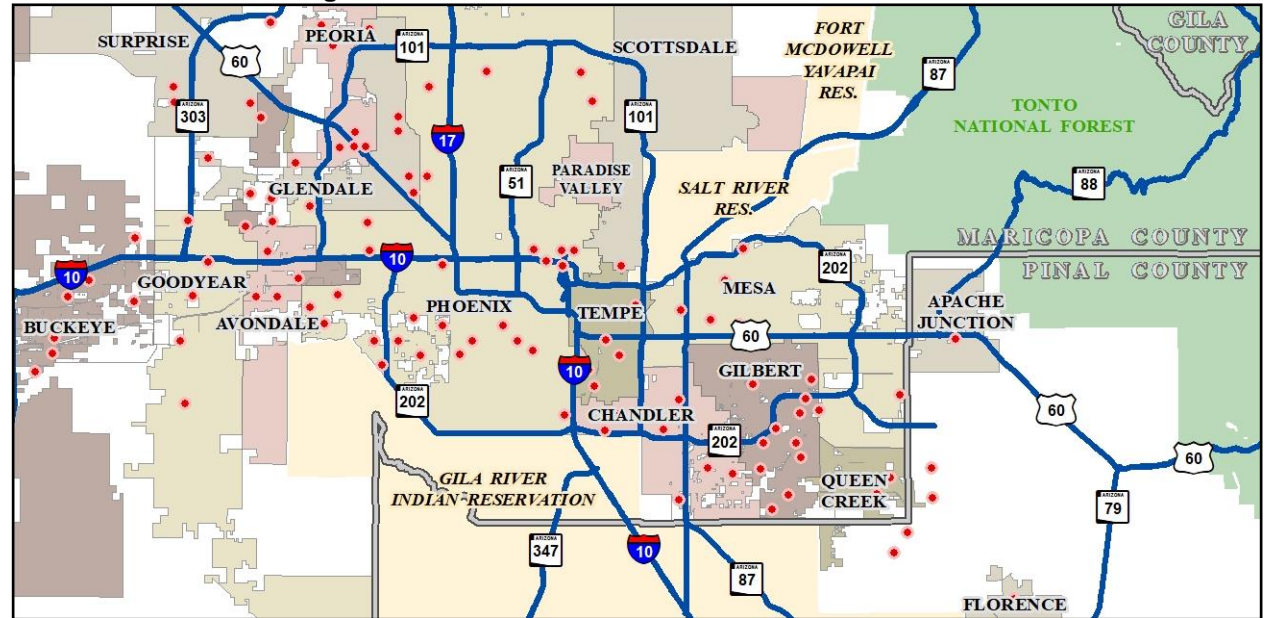

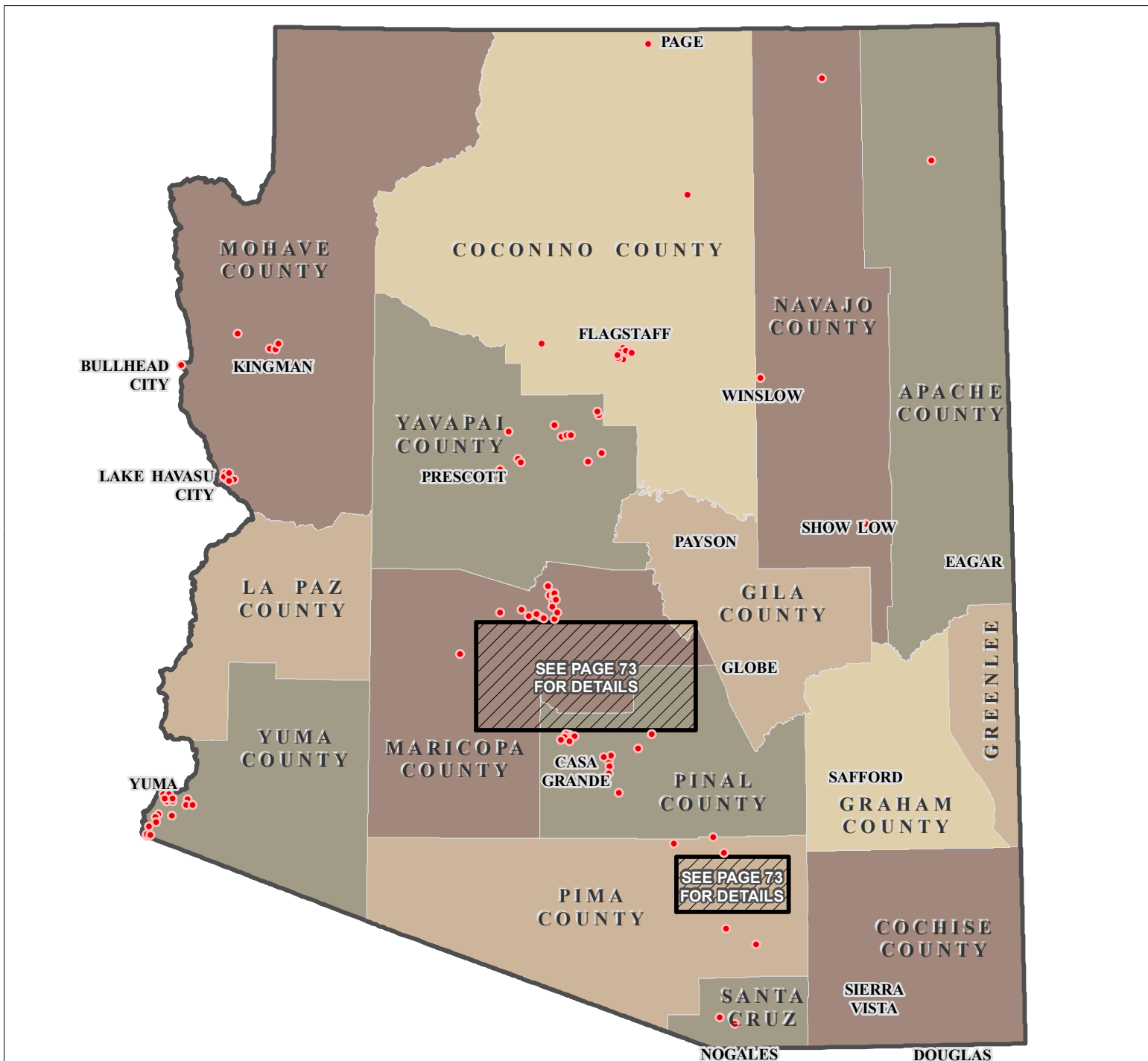

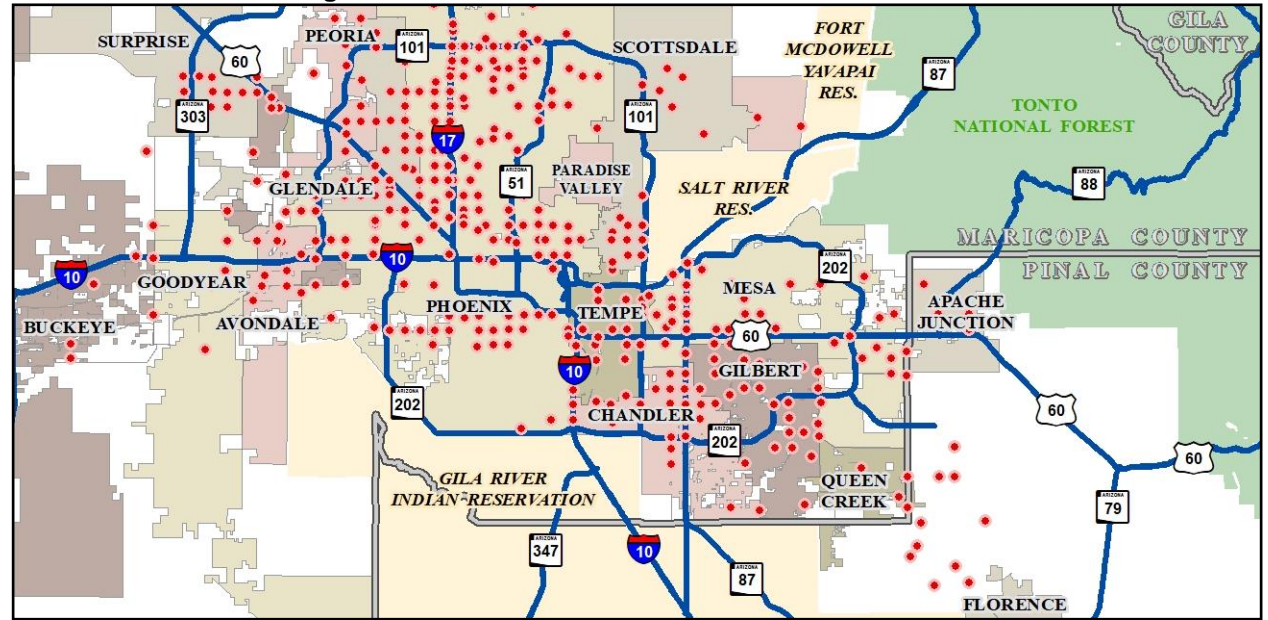
Map is showing the distribution of individuals who filed a claim for unemployment insurance benefits between March 15, 2020, and July 15, 2020.



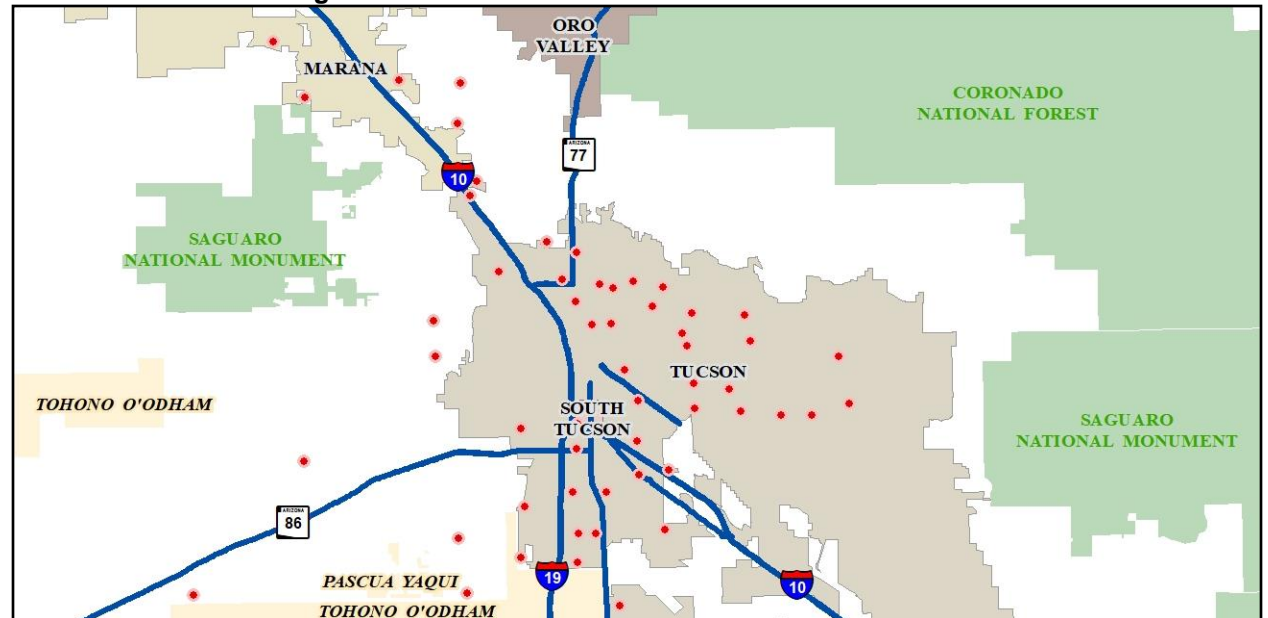

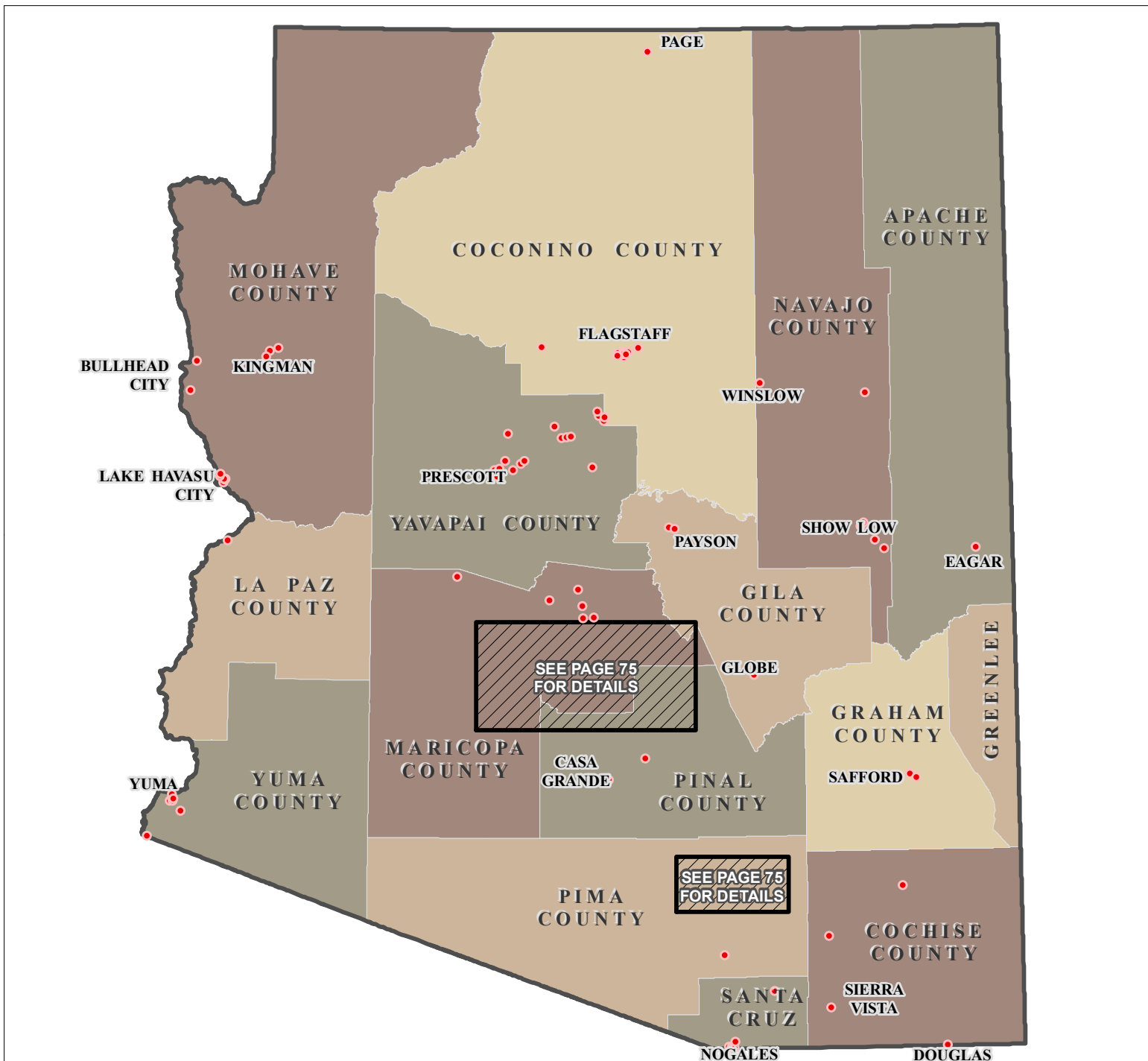

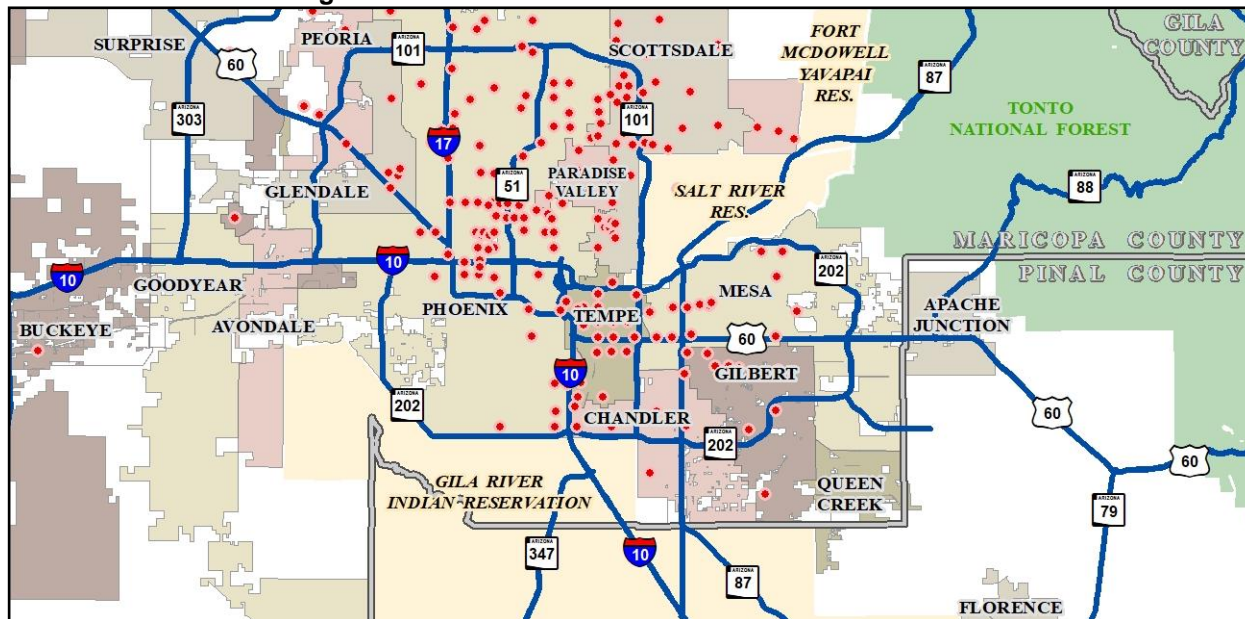

Map is showing the distribution of employers that had an active account with the Unemployment Insurance Tax Program during the month of June 2020.

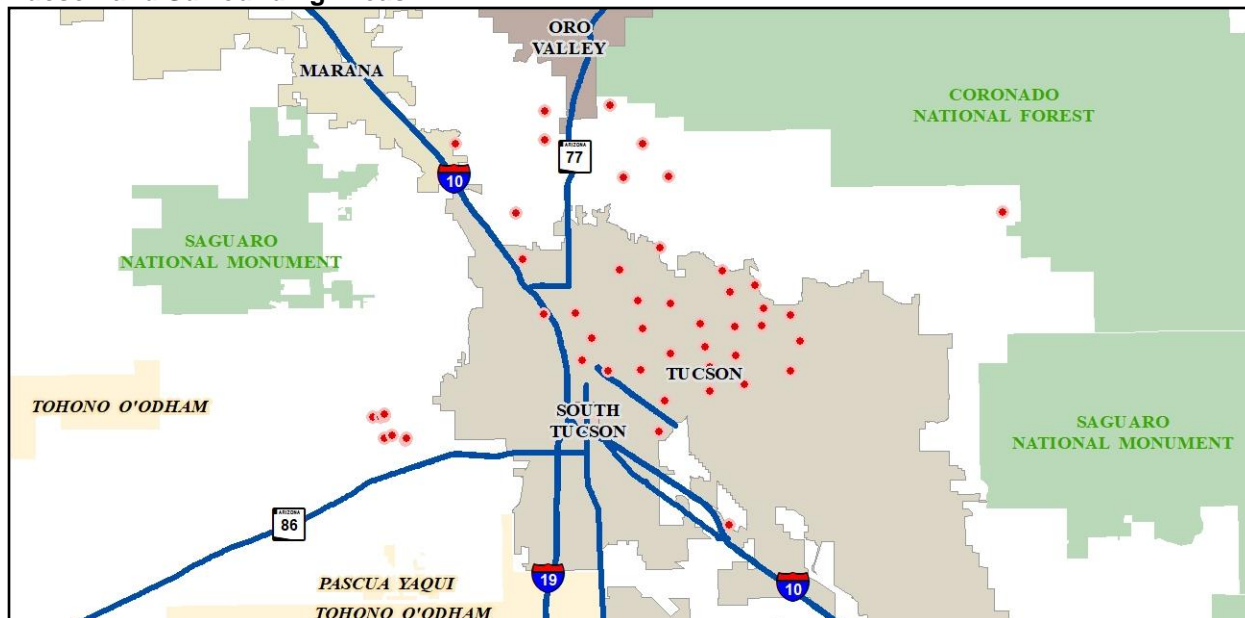

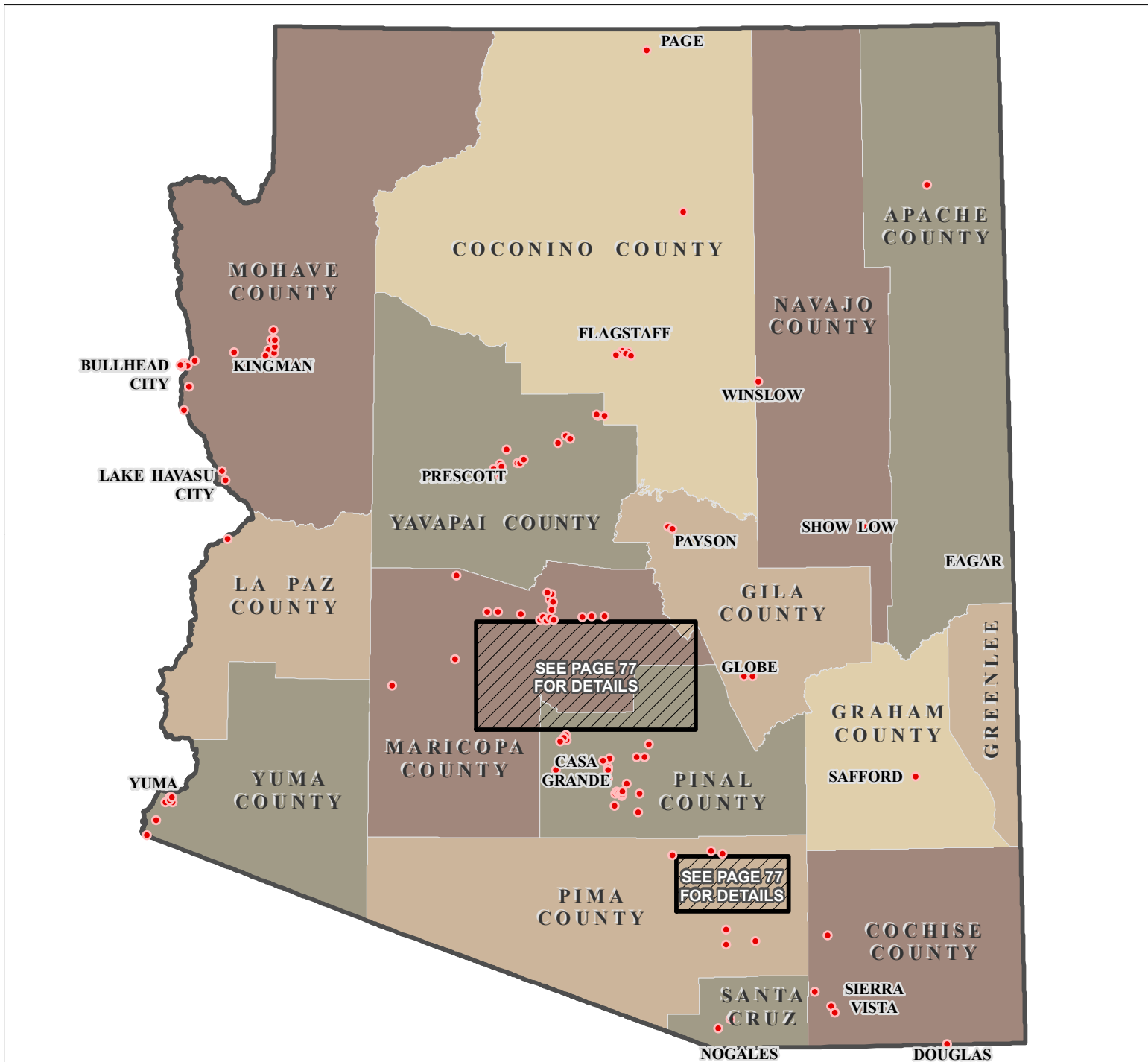

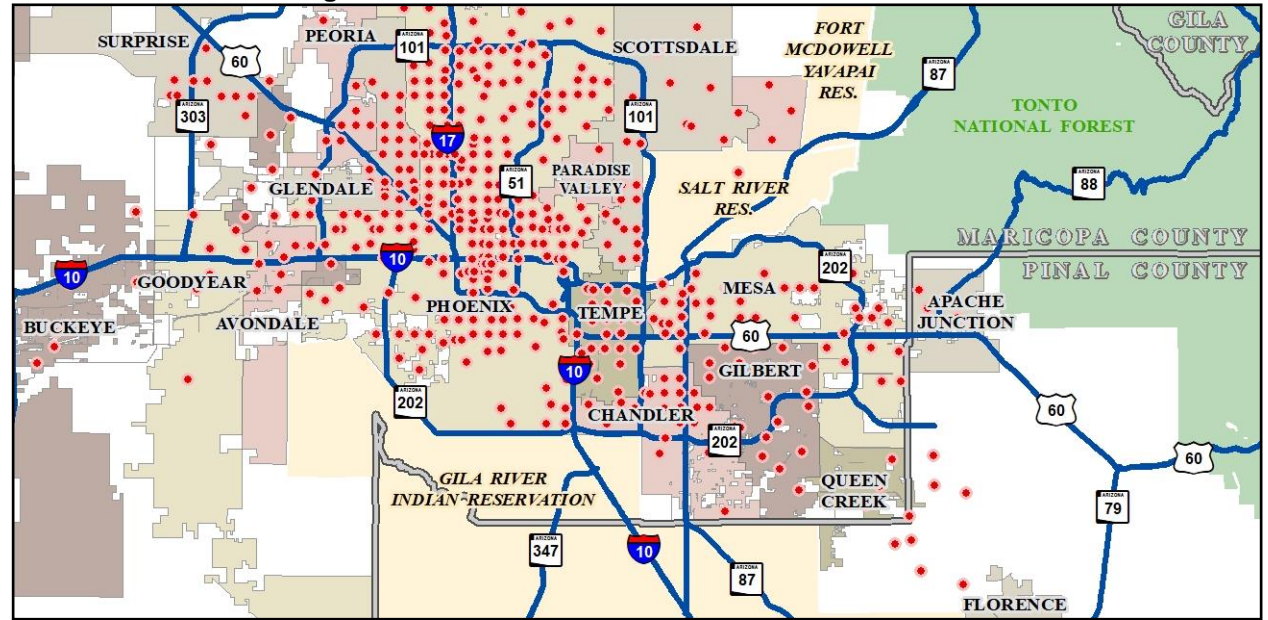

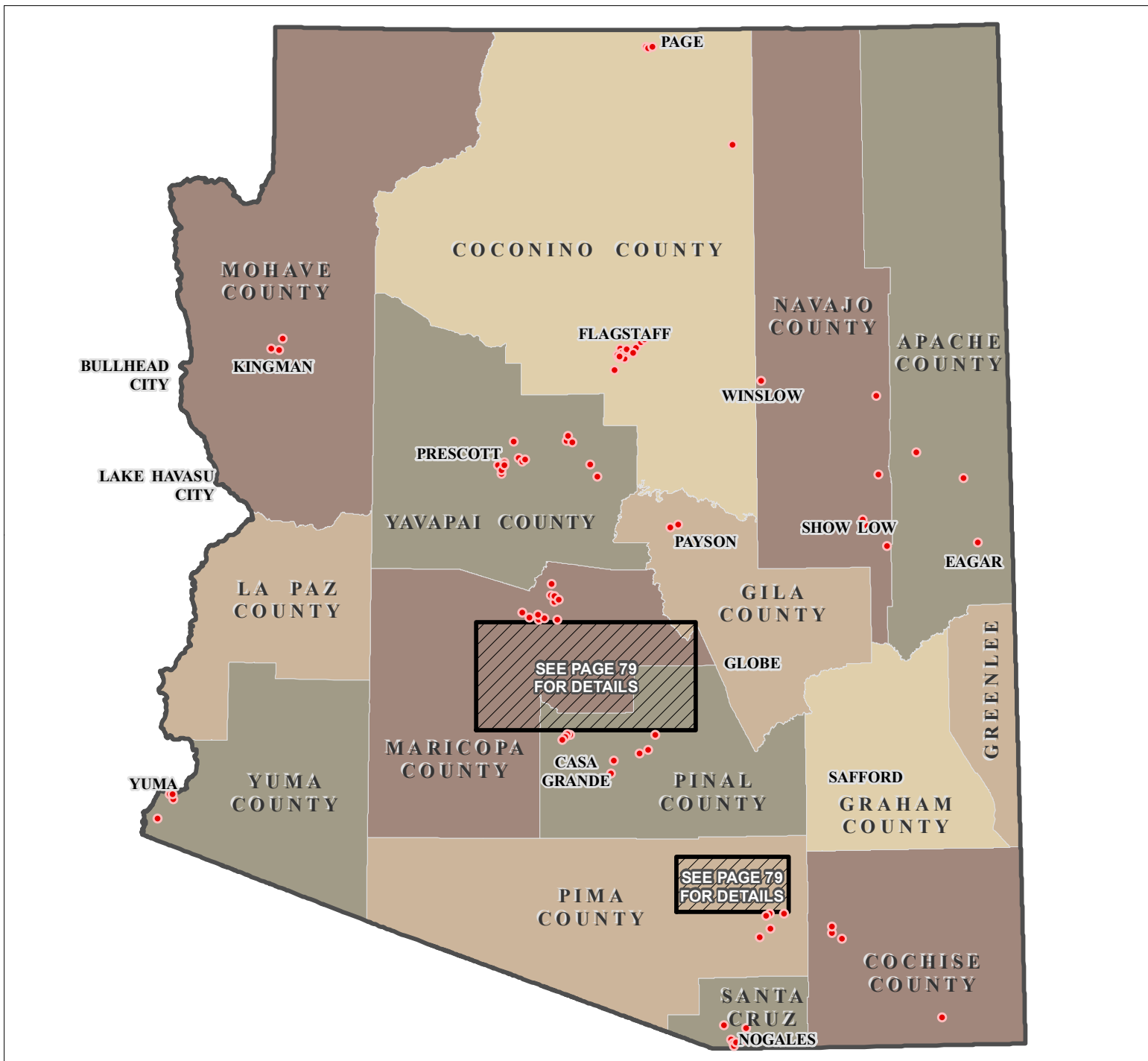

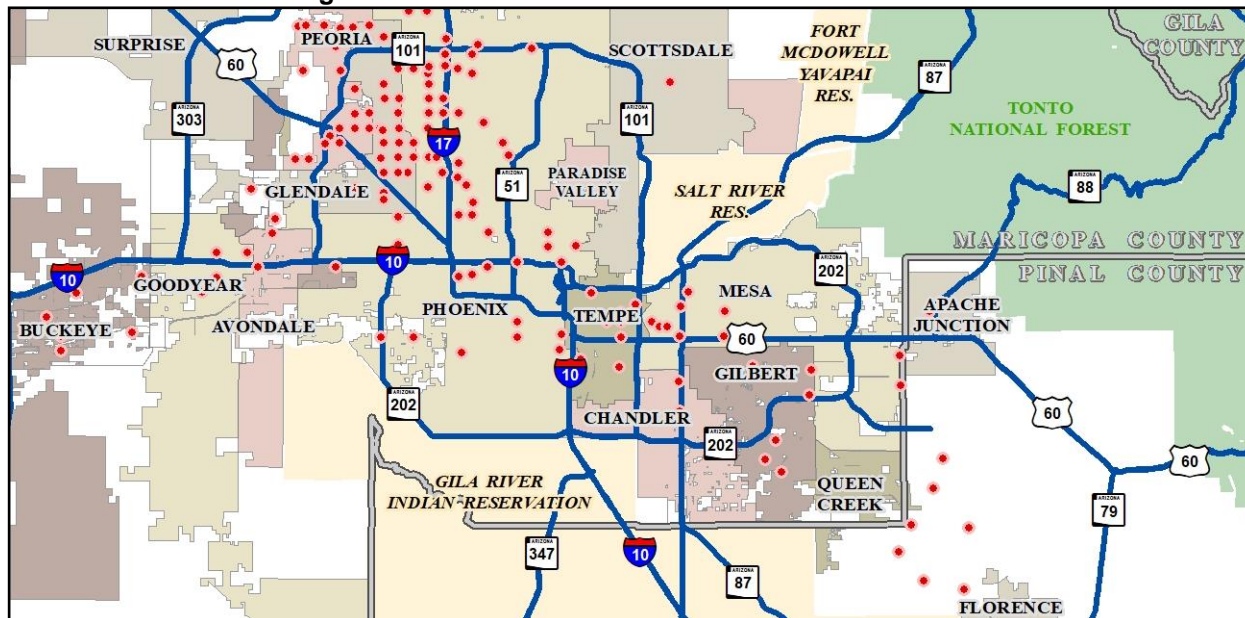

Map is showing the distribution of individuals who were active in the Vocational Rehabilitation program on June 30, 2020.

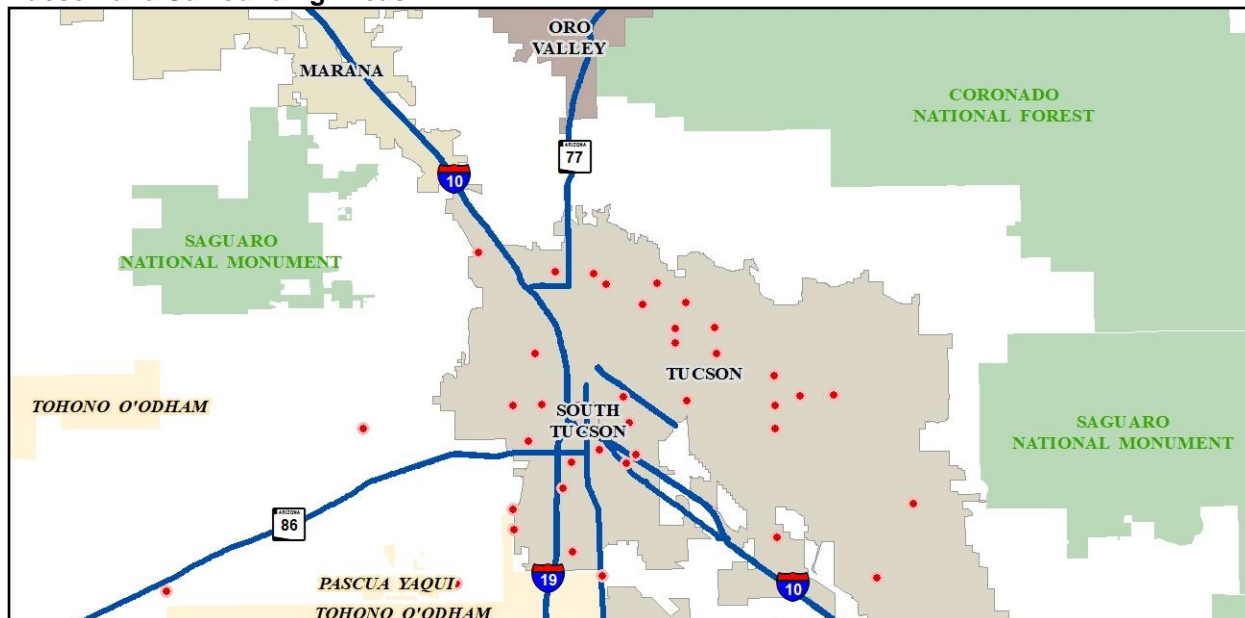
