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Arizona Early Intervention Program

The Arizona Department of Economic Security (ADES) is the lead agency for Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP) is a program within the ADES Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) serving infants and toddlers, birth through age three, with significant developmental delays or eligible established conditions in Arizona. The following are the five participating state agencies that comprise the statewide system of Early Intervention in Arizona: the Arizona Department of Economic Security, through DDD and AzEIP, the Arizona State Schools for the Deaf and Blind (ASDB), Arizona Health Care Cost Containment Services (AHCCCS), the Department of Health Services (DHS), and the Arizona Department of Education (ADE).

AzEIP's Mission

Early intervention builds upon and provides supports and resources to assist family members and caregivers to enhance children's learning and development through everyday learning opportunities.

Key Principles of Early Intervention

The following key principles adopted by AzEIP were developed by the Workgroup on Principles and Practices in Natural Environments, OSEP TA Community of Practice: Part C Settings. 1. Infants and toddlers learn best through everyday experiences and interactions with familiar people in familiar contexts.
2. All families, with the necessary supports and resources, can enhance their children's learning and development.
3. The primary role of a service provider in early intervention is to work with and support family members and caregivers in children's lives.
4. The early intervention process, from initial contacts through transition, must be dynamic and individualized to reflect the child's and family members' preferences, learning styles and cultural beliefs.
5. Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) outcomes must be functional and based on children's and families' needs and family-identified priorities.
6. The family's priorities, needs and interests are addressed most appropriately by a primary provider who represents and receives team and community support.
7. Interventions with young children and family members must be based on explicit principles, validated practices, best available research, and relevant laws and regulations.

Team-Based Early Intervention Services

Using team-based early intervention services (TBEIS), a team lead is the primary service provider in the provision of services for the child and family. The team lead has expertise relevant to support the child's needs and the outcomes on the Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP). The team lead's focus is on collaborative coaching of families as the primary intervention strategy to implement jointly-developed, functional IFSP outcomes in natural environments with ongoing coaching and support from other team members. Other team members may support the team lead, through coaching during regular team meetings and joint visits with the family. Families participate in team meetings through in-person attendance, calling-in to the meeting, or asking the team lead to share their priorities, questions, and concerns.

Interagency Coordinating Council

As required under IDEA, Part C, the Governor of Arizona has established a State Interagency Coordinating Council for Infants and Toddlers comprised of family members, providers, state agency representatives and other community members.

The ICC advises and assists AzEIP, and its partner agencies to administer, promote, coordinate and improve early intervention for families and professionals. The purpose of the ICC is to advise and assist the Department of Economic Security, as the lead agency for early intervention in Arizona, in the following areas:

- The development and implementation of the policies that constitute the statewide system of early intervention services.
- The full participation, coordination and cooperation of all appropriate public agencies in early intervention.
- Seeking information about any federal, state or local policies that facilitate and/or impede timely service delivery and taking steps to ensure that any policy, rule or statute problems are resolved.

Reorganization with the Division of Developmental Disabilities

As part of the State of Arizona's continuing efforts to improve service collaboration and maximize taxpayer value in serving families, infants and toddlers with AzEIP, ADES announced the inclusion of AzEIP in DDD beginning June 1, 2017. Identifying a developmental delay or disability early in a child's life and assisting families to support infants and toddlers to help them grow and thrive is AzEIP's mission. The administrative inclusion of AzEIP and DDD is one area that will assist AzEIP to continue and improve upon current work.

AzEIP and DDD have collaborated closely to serve and support children and families for many years, and the reorganization will ultimately lead to a more streamlined and efficient, coordinated system of supports and services for eligible children and families. Although a child who is eligible for AzEIP services under Part C of IDEA will only remain eligible until the age of three, many children will also be eligible for DDD. DDD serves eligible children, families, and individuals birth throughout their entire life. Having a continuum of services based on age, eligibility, and assessment encourages easier system

navigation for families and greater collaboration with stakeholders. Over half of all AzEIP-eligible children are also eligible for DDD due to being at risk for cerebral palsy, cognitive/intellectual disabilities, autism or epilepsy, where they may continue to be eligible after age three. Others will move into public preschool programs for children with disabilities. Hundreds of children exit early intervention each year because they reach their outcomes and their developmental milestones and no longer need AzEIP's supports and services. ADES is committed to helping children and their families continue to receive the support needed and believes the reorganization of AzEIP with DDD will increase the fiscal sustainability of the program while continuing to provide the full array of services and supports to these children and families. Strengthening AzEIP's ability to coordinate care using the team-based early intervention services approach with providers who serve individuals and families has been a positive outcome of this collaboration and reorganization.

True North

In the fall of 2017, ADES embarked on the development of a True North statement and mission statements for each Division. The True North Statement for the ADES is: *All Arizonans who qualify receive timely services to achieve their potential.* The DDD Mission statement is: *Empowering Arizonans with developmental disabilities to lead self-directed, healthy and meaningful lives.* Each Division of the ADES developed Breakthrough Objectives with Annual Improvement Plans to address Timeliness, Quality, High Performing Workforce and implementing Arizona Management System (AMS) to support the True North.

AzEIP has set forth goals to continuously improve supports and services provided to eligible children and families to ensure the implementation of the ADES True North. AzEIP continues to focus on increasing the level of compliance and correction for all programs in accordance with the DES/DDD True North. Over the past year, AzEIP has made significant strides in compliance improvement and corrective actions.

Arizona Management System

AzEIP's mission is vital to the lives of the families with infants and toddlers that we serve. Because our mission is vital, we have a responsibility to become more efficient and have better quality with the work we do. The Arizona Management System (AMS) is an intentional, results-driven approach that provides the methods and tools to drive continuous improvement. Based on Lean principles, AMS is a people-centered approach, including profound respect for the people who do the work. Governor Ducey's vision to modernize and streamline state government begins with transforming the way Arizona government operates. The goal is to make Arizona the number one state in which to live, work, play, recreate, retire, visit, do business and get an education. This can only happen with a results-driven government that works at the speed of business.

AMS was implemented as a part of the way the AzEIP does business, to ensure accountability to an evidence-based and results-driven management system. AzEIP has focused on continuing to implement the principles of AMS to identify systemic issues and address barriers, streamline processes, and more efficiently connect children and their families to quality Early Intervention Programs (EIPs) utilizing evidenced-based practices. This focus aligns with the Arizona State-identified Measurable Result (SiMR) and the implementation science approach utilized by AzEIP Staff to improve the use of evidenced-based practices by local EIPs.

The implementation of AMS has drastically improved the ability of AzEIP to track performance of all EIPs and implement improvements in processes. As a result of AMS implementation, AzEIP Staff use standard processes to identify problems, streamline processes, standardize procedures, eliminate waste, monitor and reflect on current data, and more efficiently connect children and their families to

quality services. AMS has enabled AzEIP Staff to impact two major areas of concern for the program over the past year—correction of noncompliance and increasing appropriate DDD eligibility determinations to offset AzEIP costs. More information on AMS can be found at: <https://ams.az.gov/>.

Feedback from Families

Families are offered surveys at annual reviews and again upon transition out of the program. The surveys help determine the extent that families know their rights, can effectively communicate their children's needs, and help their children learn and grow. This information is reported annually as part of Federal Indicator 4 on Family Outcomes. However, families often provide individual notes regarding the quality of services they received as part of these surveys. The surveys on the following page are some of the comments taken directly from the returned surveys to AzEIP.

"I loved having this program for my daughter. I learned techniques of how I can fully support my daughter in her learning needs with their support I felt confident in my abilities as a parent. I wish every child could have the opportunity to have access to this support system."

"Everyone that has worked with us and have come into our home have always been very helpful and have worked well with our child and us!!"

"This Early Intervention Program has made a world of a difference for our child and family. We were really struggling with his diagnosis of Autism and didn't know how to help him. Everyone on his AzEIP team has helped us so much. He is a different child now in all the best ways. Our family is stronger now, too. This program changed our lives and we are so grateful."

"Lindsay was amazing. We appreciate everything she's done for us. We're sad to lose her and Monica. They both have inspired me to be better and do better for my son. Thank you"


Early Intervention Program Comparisons to the Target

The following graphs compare each EIP to the statewide data and to the target for federal indicators. There are significant differences in numbers of children served in various regions. The data in the graphs represents the EIP data in relation to the target over the course of FFY 2016. Easter Seals Blake Foundation (ESBF) is not shown on the graphical comparisons for any of the three regions they served due to ending their contract one month in to the data collection. The children served by ESBF were transitioned to other early intervention programs or exited prior to August 1, 2016. 

Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs primarily receiving services in the home or community-based settings




Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs demonstrating substantial increase in positive social-emotional skills


Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs within age expectation for positive social-emotional skills


Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs demonstrating substantial increase in acquisition and use of knowledge and skills


Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs within age expectation for acquisition and use of knowledge and skills

Indicator 3C, Summary Statement 1: Child Outcomes


Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs demonstrating substantial increase in use of appropriate behaviors to meet their needs

Indicator 3C, Summary Statement 2: Child Outcomes


Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs within age expectations for use of appropriate behaviors to meet their needs


Indicator 4A: Family Outcomes

Percent of families reporting that services helped their family know their rights




Indicator 4B: Family Outcomes

Percent of families reporting that services helped their child develop and learn




Federal Indicator 5: Child Find Birth to Age 1

The Arizona State Demographer's Office works collaboratively with the U.S. Bureau of the Census to facilitate the use of demographic information in Arizona. OSEP prepopulates data from the U.S. Census Annual State Resident Population Estimates April 1, 2010 to July 1, 2016. Upon researching with the U.S. Census Bureau data it was discovered that age groupings are only available at state level geography and not at the county level. The Arizona State Demographer's Office develops the official population estimates and projections for the State of Arizona. It collects and reviews data (sometimes called symptomatic indicators of population change) and conducts research to improve the accuracy of the demographic models used in estimates and projections. State population projects capture the data at the county level by age groupings. In order to compare the number of children with IFSPs by age and county, the Arizona State Demographer's office provided an ad hoc report with population estimates for October 1, 2017. They are data provided by the Arizona State Demographer's Office are official population estimates and preliminary population projections and do not coincide with published data. 

Federal Indicator 6: Child Find Birth to Age 3


Indicator 6: Child Find Activities Birth to Age 3

Percent of infants/toddlers with IFSPs with eligibility decision, assessment, and initial IFSP within 45-day timeline




Percent of infants/toddlers exiting with timely transition planning and documentation of the transition steps on the IFSP

Indicator 8B: Public Education Agency Referral


Percent of infants/toddlers exiting with timely notification to the *local education agency*
