## Advance Directives End of Life Care

*Fact Sheet guidelines have been provided as general information, not as a substitution for medical treatment from a physician.*



*Advance Directives* are legal forms that help you plan your end of life care wishes that can be done when you are feeling healthy. Advanced Directives are a plan for your doctors and responsible people to follow when you are too sick or too hurt to express your wishes. You have the right to change your wishes and advance directives at any time in your life. Talk to your doctor, primary care provider or healthcare specialist to ensure your wishes are followed. These forms tell your family, friends, and health care providers about your wishes.

- Your doctor, primary care provider or healthcare specialist
- Yourself
- Your family
- Your Responsible Person
