





Launched in 2019, the Arizona Sexual Violence & I/DD Response Collaborative includes more than 50 different organizations, survivors and families. They work to ensure the needs of people who have intellectual, developmental or other disabilities aren't lost when addressing sexual violence.

The following are resources that were created and/or vetted by the Collaborative and housed at the <u>Arizona</u> <u>Coalition to End Sexual & Domestic Violence</u>.

- The "Arizona Sexual Violence & Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Response Collaborative Trainings" include training resources on sexual abuse for service providers, families and individuals with I/DD and schools.
- "Accessible Trauma Counseling Locations in Arizona for Sexual Assault Survivors with I/ DD" provides a list of confirmed counseling services that currently accept individuals with developmental disabilities who are AHCCCS eligible.
- The "Self-Advocate Resource Guide" was developed by and for people with disabilities. The guide contains links to information about healthy relationships, sexual advocacy, and sexual abuse awareness. It also includes a rating system.
- The "Preventing Sexual Abuse in Arizona Schools: 2021 Suggested Protocols for Students with Intellectual, Developmental, or Other Disabilities" provides guidelines for schools, families, and legislators.



EMPLOYEE WELLNESS – EMOTIONAL INTELLIGENCE: FEELING & THINKING (.25 CREDIT HOURS)

Course Code: REL-ALL-0-EINTELFT-V2

Emotional intelligence (EQ) is the ability to understand, express, and regulate your own emotions and your awareness of what the people around you are feeling. This module will explain a little bit about how emotions work in the brain and how developing your EQ can improve your quality of life.

EMPLOYEE WELLNESS – SIDE EFFECTS OF CARE GIVING (.25 CREDIT HOURS)

Caregiving demands a tremendous amount of compassion and empathy. While this can be incredibly rewarding, it can cause adverse side effects.

EMPLOYEE WELLNESS – STRESS MANAGEMENT (.25 CREDIT HOURS)

Stress is part of everyone's life. You can't escape stress, but you can learn to respond differently. This course will teach you to identify triggers and develop a personal stress management plan.

COMPASSION, FATIGUE AND SATISFACTION – RELIAS WEBINAR (1.25 CREDIT HOURS)

Working in a trauma-informed way requires constant focus, selfawareness, and positive energy. Accomplishing this requires that a trauma-informed approach prioritizes an organization taking care of employees, coworkers taking care of each other, and finally caring for yourself.

Today's fast paced workplace along with the 24/7 nature of the digital age has resulted in a common experience, a lack of worklife balance. Over time, this can result in job dissatisfaction and personal burnout. This course will explore the factors causing imbalance between work and home and teach you how to make changes in both areas to restore balance.

ELDERCARE LOCATOR

Individuals eligible for respite care under this program are:

- Family caregivers providing care for individuals age 60 or older or individuals living with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, regardless of age.
- Relative caregivers (not parents) 55 years of age and older providing care to children under age 18.
- Relative caregivers 55 years of age and older providing care to adults ages 18-59, with disabilities, to whom they are related by blood, marriage, or adoption.
- Tribal Organizations can set a lower age than 60 for members to be considered as elders eligible for services.


