





You can be a Lead Early Childhood Educator, And Arizona Families Need You!

What you need to become a Lead Early Childhood Educator in a Licensed Center-Based Setting

Minimum requirements are based on <u>Department</u> of Health Services Division of Child Care Licensing regulations.

- Minimum age of 18 years or older and:
 - Six months of child care experience and:
 - A high school diploma or high school equivalency diploma, or
 - At least 12 credit hours from an accredited college or university, including at least six credit hours in early childhood, child development, or a closely-related field.
 - Associate's or bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in early childhood, child development, or a closely-related field, or
 - One of the following recognized credentials:
 - National Administrator Credential (N.A.C.).
 - Certified Childcare Professional (C.C.P.).
 - Child Development Associate (C.D.A.).
 - State issued fingerprint clearance card and criminal background check.

There are various types of center-based childcare and education settings available for employment.

Privately owned	Faith based
District-based	Campus child care
Not-for-profit	Corporate child care
Head Start/ Early Head Start	Employee child care

Employment requirements may vary from setting to setting.

What you can expect when you become a Lead Early Childhood Educator

- Work an average of 35 to 40-hours per week as the primary care and education provider in a classroom setting.
- Plan and implement developmentally appropriate curriculum with infants, toddlers, and/or preschool age children.
- Demonstrate professionalism in interactions with children, families, colleagues, and community partners.
- Provide guidance and support to your classroom team members - you are the role model!
- Develop trusting and collaborative partnerships with family members while maintaining confidentiality.
- Maintain current and timely documentation of children's developmental progress.
- Engage in continuous, ongoing training and professional development.
- Collaborate with coaches, consultants, service providers, and other support-roles present within the program.
- Full-time salary and benefits are based on a variety of factors that may include experience, education level, location, and setting type.
