What it is

Employment Service is a network of public employment offices providing placement services to job seekers and labor force recruitment services to employers.

In Arizona, Employment Service is administered by the Arizona Department of Economic Security, Workforce Administration.

Who it serves

Employment Service serves all job seekers and employers who request it.

Employment Service staff provide services and refer job seekers to jobs without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, or mental or physical status (disability).

How it works

Employers post their job orders on Arizona's labor exchange system to attract qualified applicants.

Job seekers enter their qualifications into the same labor exchange system, which provides job matching of candidates.

Employment Service Staff interview job seekers to identify job experience, skills, and interests. Then refer qualified job seekers to job openings that match their skills and experience.

Matching job seekers with employers

The Employment Service matching system matches job seekers with available jobs and refers job seekers to those jobs.

Arizona also participates in a national labor exchange system, **US.jobs**, operated by the Direct Employers, a nonprofit association of employers. This partnership provides job seekers and employers with easy access to job postings and candidate resumes nationwide.

What types of jobs are available?

All types – from entry level to highly skilled.

Employers are seeking candidates for professional, technical, managerial positions, clerical and sales jobs, service sector occupations, manufacturing, agricultural, machine trades, skilled craftsmen, as well as job seekers with limited work experience.

What services are available?

Professional staff at Employment Service offices provide:

- Current labor market information
- Jobs currently in demand
- Assessment of skill levels, abilities, aptitudes
- Career guidance
- Career assessment for job seekers making career changes
- Referrals to job openings
- Job search workshops
- Job fairs
- Customized recruitment services for local companies

Specialized services for job seekers with specific needs

Job seekers with specialized needs include veterans, youth, minorities, women, workers with disabilities, unemployed workers, migrant & seasonal farm workers, mature workers, workers with limited work experience, and trade-affected workers.

Priority of Service for veterans

Veterans receive priority in all services provided by Employment Service.

The Disabled Veterans' Outreach Program (DVOP) staff provide information on veterans' benefits and ensure each veteran receives preference in all employment services. Local veterans' employment representatives (LVERs) encourage businesses to hire veterans and assist disabled veterans in securing employment.
