Convenient: Accessible from any computer that has an Internet connection.

Confidential: The application can be completed from the privacy of your home.

Eliminates Duplication: Information is entered only once regardless of the number of times it will be used on the application.

Faster: No more delays associated with having to mail an application.

Expedited Renewal: Existing information is simply reviewed and updated.

Informative: You can track the progress of your application.

Simple: Designed for easy access and navigation.

Efficient: The reduction of paper will result in more organized, proficient, and cost effective process.

Ready, Set, Go!

- 1 Make arrangements to attend a “no obligation” orientation by calling 1-877-543-7633 or obtain information by logging onto the “Children Need Homes” web page at www.azdes.gov/dcyf/adoption
- 2 The orientation will provide you with the information necessary to determine if you are ready to provide a home for a child. If so, you’ll be asked to select a licensing agency that will be responsible to assist you.
- 3 The licensing agency will provide you with a login ID and password that can be used to initiate the application by entering required information from any computer that has access to the Internet.
- 4 Once you’ve completed your application on-line it is submitted to your licensing agency. Your licensing agency will work closely with you to obtain a home inspection and complete the application process.

Moving into the 21st Century

While you’ll still be asked to sign and submit documents to your licensing agency, please know that significant progress has been made to reduce the amount of paperwork that is handled and stored by the DES.

Prior to Quick Connect about sixty pages of documents were submitted as part of the license application. Quick Connect has reduced this number to just five. This reduction in paperwork has resulted in a more organized, proficient and cost effective licensing process.
