AdSS Operations Policy Manual 201 Medicare Cost Sharing for Members Covered by Medicare and Medicaid

AdSS Operations 201, Medicare Cost Sharing for Members Covered by Medicare and Medicaid was revised with the following changes:

- Updated and added new definitions to the policy.
- Updated the Division's Medicare cost sharing requirements to align with the current ACOM 201.
- Updated the policy to current Division formatting standards.

Division Medical Policy Manual 410 Maternity Care Services

 of pregnancy and Postpartum, including when to contact the Provider for Added the statement

 Access Line (A-PAL) when questions surrounding mental health or substance use treatment, including

<u>Division Medical Policy Manual 960 Quality of Care Concerns</u>

This policy has been revised to better clarify roles of Division staff when addressing Quality of Care Concerns. Language has been added to better clarify Division staff roles, responsibilities, and process for addressing Quality of Care Concerns. Grammatical and formatting updates were made to reflect current standards.

Division Medical Policy Manual 966 Immediate Jeopardy

Immediate Jeopardy has been updated after Public Comment to correct information on heating and cooling units and setting types on page 11.

Division Provider Policy Manual Chapter 66 Behavioral Health

This policy has been revised to reflect recent AHCCCS policy updates and compliance requirements for applicable AHCCCS Standards including:

- Updates and clarifying language added to the following sections:
 - Duty to Warn
 - SMI Housing
 - Outreach, Engagement, and Re-engagement for Behavioral Health
 - Pre-Petition Screening, Court-Ordered Evaluation and Court-Ordered Treatment
 - SMI appeal process
- "Serious Emotional Disturbance" determination added for children under the age of 18.
- New section added regarding out-of-state placements for Behavioral Health treatment.
- Several sections removed from the policy that are now located in other Provider policies.
- Minimal content reorganization for better flow of information

Division Provider Policy Manual Chapter 68 Advance Directives

This policy has been revised to ensure processes are in place for hospitals, nursing facilities, hospice providers, residential service providers, and home health care or personal care services to comply with Federal and State laws regarding Advance Directives for Adult Members. [42 U.S.C. §1396(a)(57)].

- Removed an unnecessary definition and added new definitions.
- Updated language and formatting and style throughout the policy to align with the Division's Policy Format Manual.
