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Arizona Early Intervention Program

The Arizona Department of Economic Security (ADES) is the lead agency for Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The Arizona Early Intervention Program (AzEIP) is a program within the ADES serving infants and toddlers, birth to age three, with significant developmental delays or established conditions in Arizona. The following are the five participating state agencies that comprise the statewide system of Early Intervention in Arizona: the Arizona Department of Economic Security, through the Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD) and AzEIP, the Arizona State School for the Deaf and Blind (ASDB), Arizona Health Care Cost Containment Services (AHCCCS), the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS), and the Arizona Department of Education (ADE).

AzEIP's Mission

Early intervention builds upon and provides supports and resources to assist family members and caregivers to enhance children's learning and development through everyday learning opportunities.

Key Principles of Early Intervention

The following key principles adopted by AzEIP were developed by the Workgroup on Principles and Practices in Natural Environments, OSEP TA Community of Practice: Part C Settings. (2008, March).

1. Infants and toddlers learn best through everyday experiences and interactions with familiar people in familiar contexts.
2. All families, with the necessary supports and resources, can enhance their children's learning and development.
3. The primary role of a service provider in early intervention is to work with and support family members and caregivers in children's lives.
4. The early intervention process, from initial contacts through transition, must be dynamic and individualized to reflect the child's and family members' preferences, learning styles and cultural beliefs.
5. Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP) outcomes must be functional and based on children's and families' needs and family-identified priorities.
6. The family's priorities, needs and interests are addressed most appropriately by a primary provider who represents and receives team and community support.
7. Interventions with young children and family members must be based on explicit principles, validated practices, best available research, and relevant laws and regulations.

Team-Based Early Intervention Services

Team-Based Early Intervention Services (TBEIS) utilizes three primary evidence-based practices, teaming, coaching and natural learning environment. Teaming includes a team lead as the primary service provider in the provision of services for the child and family. The team lead has expertise relevant to support the child's needs and the outcomes on the Individualized Family Service Plan (IFSP). The team utilizes coaching as an adult learning strategy to support families in the enhancement of the child's development through implementing functional IFSP outcomes. Strategies and outcomes are supported in the natural learning environment with the support of other team members through either joint visits, IFSP meetings or team meetings which all include the family as a team member in decision-making.

Interagency Coordinating Council

As required under IDEA, Part C, the Governor of Arizona has established a State Interagency Coordinating Council (ICC) for Infants and Toddlers comprised of family members, providers, state agency representatives and other community members.

The ICC advises and assists AzEIP, and its partner agencies to administer, promote, coordinate and improve early intervention for families and professionals. The purpose of the ICC is to advise and assist the Department of Economic Security, as the lead agency for early intervention in Arizona, in the following areas:

- The development and implementation of the policies that constitute the statewide system of early intervention services.
- The full participation, coordination and cooperation of all appropriate public agencies in early intervention.
- Seeking information about any federal, state or local policies that facilitate and/or impede timely service delivery and taking steps to ensure that any policy, rule or statute problems are resolved.

Contract Transition

As part of ADES procurement business standard work, every five years the AzEIP office solicits for new Team Based Early Intervention Services contracts to ensure a competitive process and to provide the best possible services to families. In the Spring of 2019, new contracts were awarded. Beginning on July 1, 2019, some children and families who were involved with AzEIP experienced a change in their team and early intervention provider. Community partners who collaborated with early intervention program(s) experienced a change in a few parts of the state. The contract transition included some structural changes including revising the structure of the AzEIP regions. As a result, there are new contractors in some areas of the state and some contractors are no longer contracted to provide Team Based Early Intervention Services.

AzEIP expresses sincere appreciation to the hard work and dedication of several agencies that no longer provide Team Based Early Intervention Services including Child and Family Resources, High Country Early Intervention Program, Southwest Human Development, and United Cerebral Palsy.

Annual Determinations

Annual determinations are now included with this annual public report rather than as a separate document. When a program does not have a previous annual determination, their previous year determination will show as not applicable such as when a program has been active for less than a year. When a program is no longer contracted, their performance profile is available, but they do not receive an annual determination.

In past years, DDD and ASDB were included in the performance profile and annual determination for each of various contractors in each region which historically meant up to 42 different profiles and determinations. This year, to streamline the reporting and better understand the performance of each service providing agency, AzEIP is reporting separately on the five DDD districts and ASDB statewide performance and determinations. As a result, their determination comparison to last year cannot be reported on separately.

Feedback from Families

Families are offered surveys at annual IFSP reviews and upon transition out of the program. The surveys help determine the extent that families have been supported by AzEIP's providers to know their rights, can effectively communicate their children's needs, and help their children learn and grow. This information is reported annually as part of Federal Indicator 4 on Family Outcomes. However, families often provide individual notes regarding the quality of services they received as part of these surveys. The surveys on the following page are some of the comments taken directly from the returned surveys to AzEIP.

"Cindy was awesome and helped out tremendously. She was very supportive to our family's and daughter's needs. Cindy helped our daughter's new daycare understand her special needs and accommodate her while there. This especially helped me with my professional life and allowed me to go back to work."

"One of the most important aspects of Early Intervention services for our family is the access to resources and ideas that we didn't know about or have access to. Thank you!"

"Sherry has been amazing! She's been extremely helpful in identifying concerns with [my child] and giving solutions to address them. She's helped me feel I can be a parent to [my child] with the tips and tools she's provided. She's a great asset and you guys are lucky to have her!"

"I am glad services like this are available. It is a start plus and a lifeline to help my child plus family be able to help each other."

"The transition from [Early Intervention] to preschool was fantastic in that it was smooth, organized, and to our needs. I am not sure I could've navigated all the steps without help from AZEIP. Thank you."

Public Reporting

Early Intervention Program Comparisons to the Target


The following graphs compare each EIP to the statewide data and to the target for federal indicators.

Federal Indicator 1: Timely Provision of Services

Timely provision of services means the percent of infants and toddlers with Individual Family Service Plans (IFSPs) who receive the early intervention services on their IFSPs in a timely manner. An early intervention service is timely if it begins on or before the planned start date on the IFSP, but no later than 45 days from the date the family consents to the service.

Yearly data is not available for all programs for federal indicator 1, Timely Service Delivery. The data in the graph below represent programs in the FFY 2018 monitoring cycle that were required to submit data as part of a self-report on timely services followed by file validation from the AzEIP office. Data reported includes files for all children with initial IFSPs between April 1, 2019 and June 30, 2019. Two programs met the target.




Federal Indicator 3: Child Outcomes



Percent of Infants and Toddlers with IFSPs Who Were Functioning Within Age Expectations with Positive Social-Emotional Skills (Including Social Relationships)










Federal Indicator 4: Family Outcomes





Federal Indicator 5: Child Find (Birth to Age One)


The percent of infants and toddlers birth to age one with IFSPs compared to population data.

The Arizona State Demographer's Office works collaboratively with the U.S. Bureau of the Census to facilitate the use of demographic information in Arizona. Upon researching with the U.S. Census Bureau data, it was discovered that age groupings are only available at state level geography and not at the county level. 

The Percentage of Infants and Toddlers Birth to Age Three with IFSPs




Federal Indicator 8: Early Childhood Transition

The Percentage of Toddlers with Disabilities Exiting Part C with Timely Transition Planning Including an IFSP with Transition Steps and Services



No programs met the target.


