

WHEREAS, over 850,000 Arizona family caregivers provide critical care to individuals living with dementia, chronic disease conditions, and disabilities; older adults; and displaced children; and

WHEREAS, family caregivers perform complex medical or nursing tasks, medication management, assistance with activities of daily living such as eating, bathing, dressing, walking, and toileting; and

WHEREAS, Arizona's family caregivers provide more than \$14.5 billion of unpaid care annually; and

WHEREAS, research shows caregiving responsibilities takes an emotional, physical, and financial toll that may affect the caregiver's quality of life and contributes to increased risk of heart disease, stroke, or death; and

WHEREAS, the landmark 2022 National Strategies to Support Family Caregivers released by the Recognize, Assist, Include, Support, and Engage (RAISE) and Supporting Grandparents Raising Grandchildren (SGRG) Advisory Councils provide a framework for Arizona to support caregivers; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Department of Economic Security, Arizona Department of Health Services, Area Agencies on Aging and Arizona Caregiver Coalition will collaborate with other community partners to streamline referrals to caregiver services, programs, and resources; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona Respite Network enables the Department of Economic Security and the Arizona Caregiver Coalition to identify gaps in respite care services across the state by working with over 70 organizations to offer alternate respite options; and

WHEREAS, the month of November is observed as a tribute to Arizona's family caregivers by thanking them for selflessly providing unpaid care, at times in detriment to their own well-being, and for continuing to safeguard, advocate, and care for vulnerable Arizonans.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Katie Hobbs, Governor of the State of Arizona, do hereby proclaim November 2023 as,

FAMILY CAREGIVER MONTH
