## DAAS By the numbers

The Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS) is the smallest Division in DES, with about 250 employees who work with scores of community partners. But this tiny Division has reach, as it houses more than 30 programs. Take a look at how many Arizonans were touched by DAAS programs in SFY 17.

**8,142,157** is the number of meals distributed through the Coordinated Hunger Relief Program by community partners. *That's more than the entire population of the State of Minnesota.* 

**360,438** is the number of individuals assisted by Aging and Disability Services programs, like Caregiver Support and legal services assistance. *That's roughly the population of the entire city of New Orleans, Louisiana.* 

**31,391** is the number of vulnerable and aging adults assisted by Community Action Programs, such as the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) and Senior Medicare Patrol. *That's like filling Talking Stick Resort Arena twice*.

**13,306** is the number of individuals experiencing homelessness assisted by efforts in the Homeless Coordination Office. *That's close to the number of parking spots at the University of Phoenix Stadium.* 

**13,056** is the number of reports handled by Adult Protective Services (APS). *That many people would fill 181 school buses.* 

**7,920** is the number of individuals helped by the Domestic Violence Program. That is roughly the distance in miles from one end of the United States to the other, and back.

**1,468** is the number of refugees who obtained employment through the Refugee Resettlement Program (RRP) in coordination with community partners and faith-based organizations. *That's about half the height of Camelback Mountain*.
