### What We Do

DCADS' Statewide Homeless Coordination Office contracts with not for profit and local government entities to administer the following services throughout the State of Arizona.

# Rapid Re-Housing



Short-term rental assistance; integrated with Case Management and Supportive services.

# **Emergency Shelter**



Facilities providing temporary shelter, case management and supportive services

# **Homeless Prevention**



Short-term and medium-term rental assistance and supports that prevent eviction.

# **Street Outreach**



#### Street Outreach

Designed to meet the immediate needs of people experiencing homelessness in unsheltered locations.

## Coordinated Entry for Homeless Service Access

#### What is Coordinated Entry?

 Coordinated Entry is a simpler way for people experiencing homelessness, or at imminent risk of homelessness, to get the help they need.

#### **How does it work?**

• All three Continuums (Balance of State, Tucson-Pima and Maricopa Regional) work with local homeless service providers to establish access points in local communities across the State.

#### What are the available services?

 Each Continuum may offer a different array of services depending upon the community agencies and as funds are available.

### Coordinated Entry for Homeless Service Access

#### What is Coordinated Entry?

Coordinated Entry is a simpler way for people experiencing homelessness, or at imminent risk of homelessness, to get the help they need.

Coordinated Entry uses a fair, unbiased approach to prioritizing people for referral to housing services based on the severity

of their needs and other resources.

#### How does it work?

All three Continuums (Balance of State, Tucson-Pima and Maricopa Regional) work with local homeless service providers to establish access points in local communities across the State.

Housing services are accessed through a single assessment which is completed at any local Community Access Point.
Based on the assessment, homeless individuals and families most in need of assistance are placed on the community-wide priority list for housing assistance from which dozens of local programs accept referrals for entry into Emergency Shelter.

#### What are the available services?

- Each Continuum may offer a different array of services depending upon the community agencies and as funds are available.
  - Services may include;
    - Hotel/motel vouchers,
    - Rent, utilities and utility deposits for homeless prevention; Emergency food assistance and referral services;

    - Emergency shelter, temporary shelter, move-in assistance, rent/mortgage assistance; Clothing, case management for mean/women and families; Shelter for victims of domestic violence;

    - Programs for seniors;
    - Behavioral health services for counseling & general mental health;
    - **Employment services**
