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23 "Peer-And-Recovery Support" means a distinct health care 4. 24 25 practice involving intentional partnerships to provide social and emotional support, based on shared experiences of living with 26 27 behavioral health disorders, Substance Use Disorders, or other traumas associated with significant life disruption. This support is 28 coupled with specific, skill-based training, coaching, or assistance 29 30 to bring about social or personal change at the individual, family, or community level. These services can include a variety of 31 individualized and personal goals, including living preferences, 32 employment or educational goals and development of social 33 networks and interests. 34 35 5. "Peer-And-Recovery Support Specialist" or "PRSS" means an individual trained, Credentialed, and qualified to provide 36 peer/recovery support services within the AHCCCS programs. 37 38 6. "PRSS Continuing Education and Ongoing Learning" means activities of 39 professional development intended to enhance relevant knowledge and 40 build skills within a given practice, these activities involve: 41 Acquiring traditional Continuing Education Units (CEUs); or a. 42 b. Other activities as determined by AHCCCS.
