# Temporary Changes to Home and Community Based Services To Be Extended Through Public Health Emergency

During the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE), AHCCCS has implemented more than 47 programmatic changes in order to ensure access to care for members and to maintain the ongoing viability of its provider network.


Although the Home and Community Based programmatic changes were due to expire March 12, 2021, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has issued assurance that the authority to continue these changes (known as Appendix K) will be extended for Arizona at least until the PHE ends.

A formal approval of Arizona's Appendix K extension will be posted on the AHCCCS website upon receipt, and, in the interim, all Appendix K flexibilities will be continued.


#### **COVID-19 Member Positive Tests**

Member Positive Cases - Own/Family Home & Licensed Facilities




#### **COVID-19 Member Mortality**

The State runs vaccination sites in Maricopa, Pima and Yuma counties. As of Wednesday, March 24, 2021, any Arizonan that is age 16\* or older can register to receive the vaccine at one of these locations. These locations include:

- State Farm Stadium in Glendale
- Phoenix Municipal Stadium in Phoenix
- Chandler/Gilbert Community College in Chandler
- The University of Arizona in Tucson
- The Yuma Convention Center in Yuma.

All counties EXCEPT for Pima, Santa Cruz and Yavapai are following this distribution plan for non-state run POD locations.

**Gila County:** Gila County residents aged 16\* years of age and older can now register online to be vaccinated. La Paz County: La Paz County residents 18 years of age and older can receive the COVID-19 vaccine. Call 928-669-1100 to make an appointment.

**Mohave County:** Mohave County residents 16\* years of age and older can receive the COVID-19 vaccine. Visit

**Navajo County:** Navajo County residents 16\* years of age and older can receive the COVID-19 vaccine. **Pima County:** Adults 18 years and over, living with disabilities (physical, intellectual/developmental, mental health and /or sensory) and/or high risk medical conditions who are receiving long term care service at home can register for an available appointment at one of these sites:

**Pinal County.** All persons ages 18 and older are eligible for COVID vaccines at Pinal County locations - if they live or work in Pinal County. **Yuma County:** Yuma County residents 16\* years of age and older are eligible to receive the vaccine. Registration is available online at <a href="http://azhealth.gov/findvaccine">http://azhealth.gov/findvaccine</a> for all locations in Yuma County.

Eligible Medicaid members can get non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) to their vaccine appointment even if it is at a drive through site.

Defined by ACIP as subset of essential workers at highest risk for work-related exposure due to required work-related duties performed onsite and involve being in close proximity (<6 feet) to public or coworkers. List may vary by local jurisdiction.

Support Coordinators have begun calling members to inquire about their desire to get the vaccine and what supports they may need.

As of March 30, 2021, 7874 members/families have been contacted.

- High percentage interested in vaccine.
- Higher than expected number not interested.
- Some interested but want at a later date.
- Encourage members/families to speak with their PCP about the vaccine.

# **Electronic Visit Verification (EVV)**

EVV is being implemented as a result of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Cures Act, which is a federal requirement.

The DDD services impacted are:

- Attendant Care
- Homemaker/Housekeeping
- Habilitation Hourly
- Home Health
- Respite
   (May be provided by DDD or as a behavioral health benefit by DDD Health Plan sub-contractors)
- Skills Training and Development (provided as a behavioral health benefit by DDD Health Plan sub-contractors)



# **Electronic Visit Verification (EVV)**






