

Any funds received from the Social Security Administration (SSA) during the month after the death of a member receiving SSA benefits, shallmust not be spent, but shallmust be returned to the SSA.
44 45 46	For example, if the member dies on May 31 st , the last day of the month, and the SSA check received on the first of May 1 st was for April, the check is due and payable as the member was alive and eligible for the entire month of April.
47 48 49	However, if a check is received in June for May, the Client Fund System office returns the check asbecause the member was not eligible for SSA for the entire month of May, the month during which the member died.
50 51	B. All outstanding debts will be paid as fund balance allows, including residential billing in accordance with appropriate rule and law.
