


Monthly Progress for the Quarter

Comparison of 2022 and 2023 Referrals



The number of referrals from DDD to VR increased this quarter, in comparison to the same quarter of 2022, with 62 during the month of January, 58 in February, and 80 in March of 2023 (in 2022 there were 44 in January, 38 in February, and 58 in March). Overall referrals continued to remain higher in 2023 than compared to those received for 2022.

Employment Data for January to March



The number of members working decreased slightly from January (66) to February (63) and then increased significantly in March (81). For members who completed VR services successfully employed, the average hours they worked a week was highest in January at 28.4 hours per week, followed by March at 19.7 hours, and lowest in February 15.8 hours. Average hourly pay for those members remained relatively stable averaging \$15.07 per hour in January, February, and March. In February, the average wages of members successfully working was \$15.27, which is the highest it has been in the last 3 years.
