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## James C. Green (Charlie) Assistant Director for the Division of Developmental Disabilities



On September 24, 2018, James C. "Charlie" Green, Ph.D. was named as the new Assistant Director for the Division of Developmental Disabilities.

Dr. Green has more than 30 years of experience working with individuals with developmental disabilities and behavioral health challenges. He most recently served as the Executive Director for the Arkansas Developmental Disabilities Provider Association. Before that role, he served as Executive Vice President at Preferred Family Healthcare where he provided oversight for more than 40 behavioral health clinics and three (3) residential substance use disorder treatment facilities.

Dr. Green served the Arkansas Department of Human Services for over 18 years as the Director of the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services and Director of the Division of Behavioral Health Services. He was also the Superintendent of the Alexander Human Development Center, a 128 bed Intermediate Care Facility for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities in Alexander, Arkansas.

Dr. Green has experience as a Special Education teacher, as well as a principal of an organization that provided supported living services to individuals with disabilities. He also served as a subject matter expert to various community-based organizations focused on serving individuals with disabilities.

Dr. Green holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Physical Education and Recreation from the University of Arkansas in Monticello, a Master of Science degree in Health and Physical Education from the University of Central Arkansas and a Ph.D. in Special Education from the University of Missouri. He served his community as a member of many boards and task forces including: the Arkansas Special Olympics Board, the Arkansas Governor's Specialty Court Judicial Task Force and the Arkansas Governor's Developmental Disability Council.

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## Pregnant or Planning a Pregnancy? Get Tested for HIV.

# An HIV+ pregnant woman can transmit HIV to her baby 3 ways:

- During pregnancy
- During vaginal childbirth
- Through breastfeeding

# HIV Positive & Pregnant? Early Treatment (medication) can:

- Protect the health of the mother
- Lower the risk of passiving HIV to her baby

Get Tested for HIV when you are planning a pregnancy or as soon as possible after you find out you are pregnant Ask your Primary Care Provider or OB/GYN about HIV testing. If the test is positive, counseling and treatment are available through your health plan.

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# Suicide Prevention

Suicide is the 10th leading cause of death in the United States. It is the 8th leading cause of death in Arizona. On average, one person dies by suicide every seven (7) hours in Arizona alone.

There is not any one single cause for suicide. Most often, when a person's stress or health issues are more than what they can cope with, they feel helpless and hopeless<sup>1</sup>. If this is not addressed, a person's risk for suicide increases.

People with a developmental disability may be at risk for suicidal thoughts or behaviors due to their:

- Physical or emotional pain
- Physical disability
- Intellectual disability
- Other social and economic stressors<sup>2</sup>

One theory about suicide risk, states that people who feel that they are a burden, or that they do not belong, are at a higher risk for suicidal thoughts and behaviors<sup>3</sup>.

Not everyone who is at risk will go on to attempt suicide, but it is important to know what to do if someone you know is thinking about harming themselves.

#### **Prevention:**

- Encourage the person to get treatment -Reach out to behavioral health resources to get support and look into treatment options
- Provide emotional support
- Make sure medications are taken when and how they are prescribed
- Make sure old medications are properly disposed of
- If the person has a plan to die by suicide, do not leave the person alone. Call 9-1-1 if necessary

If a person says they are considering suicide:

- Take the person seriously
- Actively listen without providing advice
- Stay with them
- Help them remove all lethal means, including weapons and substances
- Call the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline: 1-800-273-8255
- Text TALK to 741741 to text a trained crisis counselor from the Crisis Text Line at no cost, 24 hours/7 days a week.
- Take them to mental health services or an emergency room

<u>www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan</u> offers a search tool to find out which plans cover your medications.


